The Washington Street Produce Market supplies most of the food to New York City's populace. It covers 50 acres and moves more than 100,000 carloads of fruit and vegetables each year. It can accommodate 400 trucks at a time and often has 3500 more lined up waiting to unload. The market is never closed and New Yorkers receive fresh fruits and vegetables daily, though in a less orthodox manner than most of the country. The sidewalks are lined with crates and boxes of produce. Stepping on rotting cabbages, celery, etc. continues in spite of city health ordinances. There should be a better way to feed the city's millions but it certainly would not be as colorful.
