

House Group Okays Legislation To Avert National Rail Strike

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The House Commerce Committee today approved legislation to avert a nationwide rail strike Thursday while the Senate squared off for what a Republican leader said would be a real shooting match over a similar bill.

Senate Republican Leader Everett Dirksen, Ill., said opposing Senate forces were "coming out of all corners shooting" over a bill to set up a seven-member board to arbitrate the 4-year-old dispute.

With one key exception, the House bill was similar to the Senate version. It would not subject the so-called secondary issues to arbitration. The Senate bill would provide for arbitration of these matters if no agreement was reached by collective bargaining within 30 days.

Both would provide that the two primary issues, the need for firemen on freight and yard service diesels and over-all make-up of train crews, be resolved by arbitration binding on both the unions and the carriers.

The administration is gunning hopefully but not optimistically for enactment of legislation by Wednesday to avert a threatened nationwide rail strike one minute after midnight local time that day.

Drops Kennedy Proposal
Like the Senate bill, the House legislation dropped President Kennedy's proposal that the Interstate Commerce Commission be handed the problem of settling the dispute.

While the House measure would not allow the arbitration board to touch issues beyond the questions of firemen and crews, it would forbid a strike over secondary disputes for 150 days after the bill is enacted.

If both chambers pass a differing bill, it would require setting up a House-Senate conference committee to work out a compromise. This could mean delaying action beyond the Thursday strike threat date.

House Commerce Chairman

Oren Harris, D-Ark., said the committee adopted the amendment to limit arbitration to the key issues because industry and government officials all had testified these alone had prevented a settlement.

The bill now goes to the traffic cop House Rules Committee, which is expected to clear it Tuesday for a House vote on Wednesday.

The Senate was scheduled to begin debate on its bill later today.

Officials Probe Crash Landing Of West Coast Plane In Alberta

CALGARY, Alta. (UPI) — An investigating team flew here from Seattle Sunday to investigate the crash-landing of a West Coast Airlines plane with 15 persons aboard late Saturday night.

Eight of the 12 passengers aboard and the crew of three either escaped injury or were released from the hospital after treatment. The other four remained hospitalized.

The plane, a Fairchild F27 twin-engine turboprop, was on the final leg of a flight from Portland, Ore., to Calgary when the accident occurred. The plane crashed-landed in a farm field about a mile from Calgary's McCall Airport.

The investigating team from Seattle was composed of West Coast Vice President Harold Wallis, two Federal Aviation Agency investigators and an insurance adjuster.
