George Benton Favored 2-1 Over Smith

NEW YORK (UPI)—A nationally televised middleweight fight plus non-title bouts for champions Willie Pastrano and Eddie Perkins stand out on this week's boxing schedule.

Middleweight contender George Benton of Philadelphia meets slugger Johnny Smith of Los Angeles, champion of California, in a TV 10 rounder Saturday night at the Los Angeles Olympic Auditorium. Benton is favored at 2-1 because he is rated fighter No. 4 among contenders by World Boxing Association and No. 6 by the Ring Magazine. Smith is unranked.

However, Smith—only 24—has a nine-year advantage over Benton. Smith's 28 fights include 22 wins (18 by KOs) and six defeats. Benton's 48-8-1 record includes 27 knockouts. Also Saturday night, light heavyweight champion Pastrano of Miami Beach makes his first appearance since winning the 175-pound crown from Harold Johnson on June 1. He engages in a

non-title 10-rounder at Jacksonville, Fla., against Jacksonville's Ollie Wilson.
Junior welterweight champion Perkins of Gary, Ind., meets third-ranked Bobby Scanlon of San Francisco in a non-title 10-rounder at Sacramento, Calif., Tuesday night.

Padres Bid For First Place In PCL's Southern Division

Baseball fans are comparing the San Diego Padres with Silky Sullivan, the thoroughbred well known for charging from last place in the field to win many a race.

The Padres are making a determined bid to move into first place in the Southern Division of the Pacific Coast League. On Aug. 4 manager Don Hefner's club was 7½ games out, but now has battled to within 4 games. They have won 14 of their last 20 games and are pointing for a spot in the best of seven play-offs, which begin in the Northern Division city, Sept. 10. This was decided upon by the flip of a coin over the weekend. Sept. 13 will be an off day for travel with the series continuing Sept. 14 in the Southern Division city.

After six starting pitchers finished their assignments without relief, Jim Owens needed assistance in Sunday's second game of a twin bill with Tacoma. The Padres lost the game, 7-5 and the win broke an 11 game losing streak for the Giants. San Diego won the opener 3-2.

In other games, Dallas-Ft. Worth took a pair from Denver 6-2 and 2-0 to slip into second place, one-half game ahead of San Diego. Oklahoma City clung to its Southern Division lead with a 4-2 victory over Salt Lake City in 10 innings and Portland moved out of the basement in the Northern Division by whipping Seattle

twice 5-2 and 3-2. Hawaii blanked Spokane 4-0.

Sammy Ellis notched his 10th win in the first game against Tacoma as the Padres tallied twice in the ninth to win. Bobby Klaus third hit scored Tommy Helms with the deciding marker. Mel Queen had a solo homer in the fourth for the Padres.

In the nightcap Danny Rivas scored his 12th victory and had batting help from Jesus Alou and Cap Peterson, each with three runs batted in. Paul Smith scored three times after drilling three singles for Tacoma.

Ted Sadowski registered his fourth shutout and 13th victory of

the year in the nightcap against Denver after Gary Dotter won the opener 6-2. In the first game Ray Jablonski smashed a home run with one on and the Rangers coasted the rest of the way. Cesar Tovar slapped a home run in the third inning of the nightcap for the only runs of the game. A home run by Danny Murphy with a mate aboard gave the 89ers their victory over the Bees in the 10th. Gordy Seyfried went all the way for the losers while Tom Borland, the third hurler, took the Oklahoma City victory.

Roseburg Elks Claim 4-3 Billiard Win Over Medford

The Roseburg Elks' Timber Toppers billiard team defeated Medford 4-3 in a down-to-the-wire match here Saturday afternoon before a sizable crowd at the Elks Hall.

In the feature match between the champions of the two teams, Dick Stevenson of Roseburg and George "Dinny" Moore of Medford, Moore came up with a close 50-43 victory.

According to Roseburg's manager Doss Burgess, the game was nearly even at the halfway mark (27-25 for Moore) when Moore came up with three runs of three and a lone run of five (longest in the tournament) to take a commanding lead. He bogged down at 47 and Stevenson began to catch up, but Moore finally pieced together three more points to win. This was the third match between the two club champions and Moore's second win.

The No. 2 spot proved to provide the most excitement, as Roseburg's Bo Boucock and Medford's Perce Cully pulled into a 29-29 deadlock in a 30-point game. They both had two shots in the number one hole before Boucock made a spectacular shot to claim the victory, 30-29.

In the No. 3 spot, Roseburg's Craig Short played a very sharp game and stayed in front all the way to win 30-21 over Dick Milestone.

In the No. 4 game, Roseburg's Len Brower squared off against Medford's Bud Galle, serving as manager in place of Dr. William Miller. Brower, a power shooter, had plenty of trouble with Galle, regarded as strictly an "oil player" before he managed to defeat Galle 30-24.

Len Leinonen, the Roseburg team's "rookie" was moved up to the No. 5 spot and gave Chris Renkin, one of Medford's top players, a tough battle before dropping a 30-22 decision.

In the No. 6 game, Roseburg's Joe Foote played one of his best games and tied Medford's Larry Luy 27-27. Foote then missed a shot by a narrow margin and left Luy a natural. Luy took advantage of the leave and won 30-27.

In the No. 7 spot, John Bingham, Roseburg's stylish defensive ace, played a sharp game and defeated Medford's Ernie Winkle 30-22.

There was a banquet for the players held after the tournament.

Gonzalez May Face McClure

NEW YORK (UPI) — Wilbert (Skeeter) McClure, unbeaten middleweight contender from Toledo, Ohio, apparently will be the next opponent for Puerto Rican contender Jose Gonzalez, who whipped Argentina's Rocky Rivero in a nationally televised fight Saturday night.

The World Boxing Association ranks McClure seventh among 180-pound contenders; Gonzalez, 10th. Gonzalez won a 7-3, 8-2, 5-4-1 decision Saturday night over pudgy but explosive Rivero. There were no knockdowns.
