

Reading Workshop To Draw Teachers

Supt. Norman York of the Canyonville School District announces a reading workshop to be held at the Canyonville Elementary School this Friday beginning at 9 a.m. There will be both morning and afternoon sessions.

According to York, all interested teachers are invited to attend the workshop which will feature phonetic keys to reading. Stella Warren, primary teacher from Lewiston, Idaho, will conduct the workshop. She will explain and demonstrate the use of phonetic keys to reading and keys to independence in reading in grades one through five.

The program to be demonstrated makes more use of phonics than the current reading programs, however, it does not cover the "old-fashioned" phonics used many years ago. York said.

Time will be allowed at both sessions Friday for question and answer periods.

Provision for the workshop will be provided free of charge by a company specializing in the publishing of phonetic reading method materials.
