At the regular August meeting, Aethel Oliviant presented to the

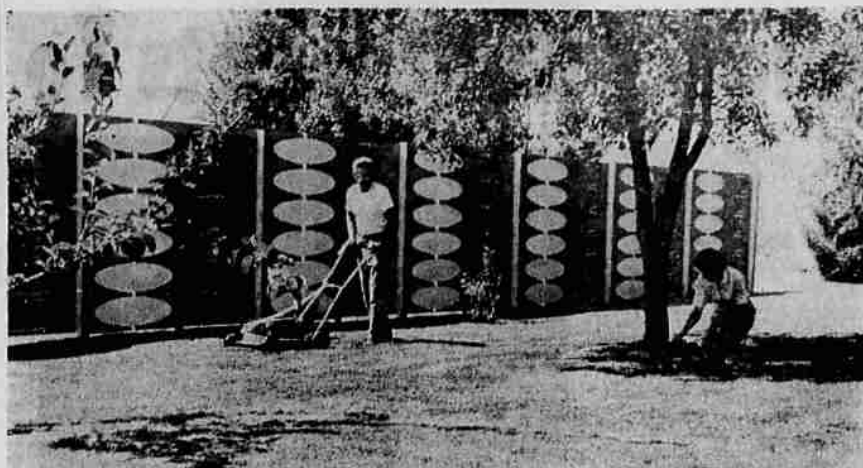

ATTRACTING MUCH ATTENTION in the Carnes Road area is this striking plywood fence recently completed by Mr. and Mrs. Cecil Thompson of Rt. 4, Box 258, Roseburg. Three-eighths-inch plywood cut to six-foot height was used for the panels which were attached to 4-by-4 treated posts sunk 40 inches into the ground. Thompson achieved the novel louvered effect by using a sabre saw to partially cut 10 1/2-inch-wide ovals (the sides remain attached) and forcing wood strips down the length of the panels, as demonstrated in the back sides. Both sides of the fence appear the same, in this case benefiting neighbor Dean Rammage who gave Thompson an assist in the fence construction. Shake paint in soft shades of green and yellow completed the job.
