

Southern Belles Capture Honors At Atlantic City

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J. (UPI)—Save your Confederate money, boys, the South is rising again—only this time the girls are leading the comeback, with the weapons only a woman has, at the Miss America pageant.

Two southern belles—Miss Virginia and Miss Alabama—reigned today as the winners of the first preliminary talent contest Wednesday night over 16 other contestants on the basis of her singing of a medley of two musical comedy-type songs and a semi-classical number. She is the oldest candidate in the pageant.

Miss Virginia, 23-year-old Dorcas Campbell, bears a close resemblance to Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy. She won the first preliminary talent contest Wednesday night over 16 other contestants on the basis of her singing of a medley of two musical comedy-type songs and a semi-classical number. She is the oldest candidate in the pageant.

Miss Alabama, Judith Short, 18, is a statuesque blonde of five feet, seven and one-half inches. She captured the swim suit contest in a white bathing suit with her golden hair curling about her shoulders as she tripped along the runway extending out past the 11 judges and into the audience at Convention Hall. There were 17 other contestants.

Dorcas, of Fairfield, Va., is an accomplished soprano with four years of formal voice training. "But I've been singing all my life" — and considerable experience singing in summer stock and on radio and television. She hopes to sing opera.

She also made an appearance as soloist with the Chicago Symphony with Arthur Fiedler as guest conductor. Fiedler is one of the judges at the Miss America contest.

Judy is a former high school baton-twirling star who has studied piano and dance since early childhood but who has switched her interest to the marimba, which she will play when her talent group competes Friday night.

The hazel-eyed, 122-pound Birmingham-Southern College freshman said her victory Wednesday night was a complete surprise. "I thought, well, this just isn't my category so I'll just enjoy myself," she said. "So I did."

"This is the last thing I expected to happen because my brother has always accused me of being chubby."

D'Ann Competes In Two Contest Events Today

ATLANTIC CITY — Miss Oregon — Roseburg's D'Ann Sharon Fulton, faces hurdle No. 2 tonight in her quest for the Miss America crown.

She will compete in the evening gown competition.

And this afternoon she'll be interviewed by a panel of 11 judges. They'll talk with her for several minutes. Then they'll rate her for poise, personality and profile.

The ratings are never announced. Neither is the winner of the evening gown division. But the ratings count in determining who the pageant's 10 semi-finalists will be.

Last night, D'Ann competed in the swim suit sweepstakes. Promising on the runway, she was a crowd favorite. The judges, however, named only one winner, and this honor went to Miss Alabama, Judith Antoinette Short, of Birmingham, whose assets add up to 36-22-36.

Winner of last night's talent tourney was Miss Virginia, Dorcas Campbell, of Fairfield, who sang a medley of songs.

D'Ann was one of the first to congratulate the two winners. "They're both lovely girls," she said. "I'm glad they won."

Panic Of Passengers Seen Cause Of Swiss Air Crash

ZURICH, Switzerland (UPI) — Fire aboard a Swissair jetliner probably caused panic to break out seconds before the plane crashed Wednesday killing all 80 occupants, authorities said today. Airline spokesmen said the fire apparently forced the twin-jet Caravelle out of control and made it plunge into a field near

the village of Duerrenmaesch, 20 miles west of Zurich.

Li Fritz Meier, deputy chief of the Aargau district police and in charge of police forces at the crash site, said "the aircraft was flaming in the rear section, both inside and outside before the crash."

"Panic most probably broke out because passengers without doubt saw the flames," he said.

One American Aboard

The Caravelle was carrying 6 crew members and 74 passengers, including one American and one-fourth the population of one Swiss hamlet. It was en route to Rome via Geneva.

About 200 federal investigators, policemen and soldiers waded through knee-deep mud this morning in search of clues to the cause of the mishap, the worst in Swissair's 32-year history.

The airline spokesman said an automatic extinguisher system aboard all Caravelles usually is capable of putting out fires in either jet engine, which are attached to the fuselage at the rear of the plane, but the flames Wednesday somehow caused the pilot to lose control.

Swissair spokesmen said sabotage is always a possibility in any plane crash, but in this case it is "practically out of the question."

Shattering Explosion

There was a shattering explosion as the big jet dug 50 feet into the ground. Half the aircraft simply disintegrated. Slivers of metal from the remainder rained over an area a mile square.

Eyewitnesses said flames gushed from the Caravelle's port engine as it plummeted toward earth. But there were indications the pilot's last words—"no more, no more"—would remain an enigma.

Col. Carl Hoegger, head of the Swiss Air Bureau's accident investigation department, said the cause of the crash probably will remain a mystery.

He also said identification of the bodies would be impossible because of the tremendous impact.

Authorities called in bulldozers to help dig out parts of the jetliner and bodies imbedded with it.

Accompanying the overseer is a group which will provide special music at tonight's services. All arrived today in the church's air plane, a Beech twin-engine craft, which accommodates five passengers, in addition to the pilot and co-pilot.

The Rev. John Clarno, minister of the local church, already a licensed pilot, has been taking additional training in order to acquire his multi-engine license. This will qualify him to become an alternate pilot for the church aircraft which experiences heavy usage when the Rev. Mr. Crawford makes his frequent trips to many places in the United States.

In his capacity as general overseer of the International Apostolic Faith Church, the Rev. Mr. Crawford is expected to give his approval of the proposed changes to the interior of the Roseburg church.
