

2 Firemen Win Promotions On Retirement Of Captain

Glen Burgess has been promoted from firefighter to lieutenant. He has been with the department since Sept. 1, 1960.

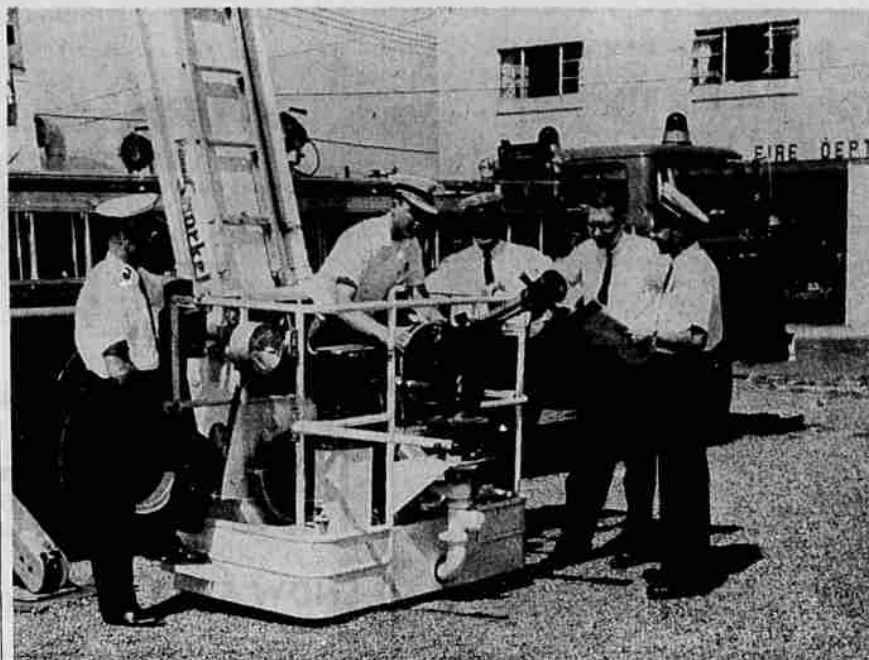
Siebold said the appointment, effective Sept. 1, was on the basis of competitive test results. A written examination of 120 questions prepared for use by fire departments was given, along with an 80-question oral test given by Siebold. Further, candidates were interviewed by Clyde Centers, North Bend fire chief and Joe Nagle, assistant chief there.

The paid department currently is short one man. Nelson had been with the department about 12 years and had reached retirement age. He has taken over the fire equipment sales and service business of Glen Taylor, a former Roseburg fire chief.

Anderson's Attack Reveals Resentment Of Military To McNamara's 'New Era'

WASHINGTON (UPI)—A slashing attack by retired Adm. George W. Anderson brought into the open today the resentment of many of the nation's professional military men over Defense Secretary Robert S. McNamara's "new era" at the Pentagon.

In perhaps the most devastating criticism yet leveled at McNamara's policies, Anderson told the National Press Club Wednesday he saw "alarming perils" in attempts to obscure the role of the military under the defense secretary's civilian leadership.

Both the White House and the Defense Department maintained silence on the speech by Anderson, who was dropped as chief of naval operations on McNamara's recommendation after only one two-year term.

"I am gravely concerned that within the Department of Defense there is not the degree of confidence and trust between the civilian and military echelons that the importance of their common objective requires," Anderson said.

Anderson, who told a Senate investigating committee he opposed McNamara's decision in the controversial TFX fighter plane contract, said Napoleon "became intolerant of much-needed criticism in his own command."

"There can be no hesitancy to

criticize where that criticism is constructive and motivated only by consideration of the best interests of the United States," Anderson said.

Anderson added, "Before com-

mittees of Congress the service chiefs must always be allowed and encouraged to give their whole opinion, not subject to any retaliation against them or their service."

Fairgoers Favor Tax On Cigarettes

SALEM (UPI)—A straw vote at the Oregon State Fair indicates a state cigarette tax is favored by a 59 per cent of the Republicans and 56 per cent of the Democrats voting.

A sales tax won support from 54 per cent of the Republicans and 43 per cent of the Democrats.

A test of a new electronic vote tabulating method is being conducted at the fairgrounds by the secretary of state's office. If it is successful, it may be tested in general election next year.

Preliminary results showed fairgoers overwhelmingly favored a cigarette and sales tax as revenue sources if more tax money is needed by the state.

Of the 1074 Republican ballots sampled, 641 favored a cigarette tax and 384 a sales tax.

The 746 Democratic ballots showed 424 favored a cigarette tax and 325 a sales tax.

Voters were asked to choose two tax alternatives from a list of five. Others listed were an increase in present income tax rates, a state property tax, and a net receipts tax.

Forest Fire Danger Soars In Northwest

Forest fire danger climbed in the Northwest today as dry air and warm temperatures covered the region for the second day.

The trend was expected to last another day east of the Cascades, but cooler air and showers were forecast for western Oregon and Washington Thursday.

Eight small fires were reported on state-protected lands Tuesday. All were controlled quickly.

The U.S. Forest Service in Portland reported 20 fires in Oregon and Washington Tuesday burned a total of three acres. All but seven were caused by lightning.

An 80-acre forest fire in Northern California caused trouble for state and federal crews along the Modoc-Lassen County line near the community of Likely before being encircled Tuesday.
