but one South, Paul Levitt of Sioux City, Iowa, had other ideas. In spite of the fact that the three of hearts had not appeared, Paul was sure that West had opened a five-card suit and had the ace of diamonds as a sure re-entry. He had also shown up with four clubs so he was likely to be short in spades.

Paul cashed the ace of spades, entered dummy with the king, noting that West had dropped the ten. He led a third spade and finessed his nine. When it held Paul was in clover.

The three of hearts was still missing, but Paul had already made up his mind where that card was. Hence West was down to a singleton ace of diamonds. Paul led a low diamond. East cashed his ace and that three of hearts, but Paul made the last two tricks with the minor suit of diamonds.

Idaho Solon Backs Rocky

BOISE (UPI)—Republican U.S. Sen. Len Jordan had an early political breeze kicking up in Idaho today in the wake of his statements that he will run for re-election in 1968 and support Gov. Rockefeller if the New Yorker is nominated for president.

These comments stood out at a Boise press conference by the junior Idaho senator Tuesday.

Jordan surprised reporters by refusing to duck when asked about his plans when his four-year short term runs out in 1966.

"As of now I intend to run for re-election," Jordan said. "I've never intended it to be a one-shot deal."

Political observers noted this could put Jordan in conflict with Gov. Robert E. Smylie. Smylie will complete his third term as governor in three years and already is considered a possibility for the Senate race in 1966.

Smylie appointed Jordan to the post when Sen. Henry C. Dworshak died last summer. Jordan, a former governor, then won the short term in a November race against Democratic Rep. Gracie Post.

Jordan said he would "accept" Nelson Rockefeller if the governor wins the Republican presidential nomination. But Jordan, an avowed conservative, made it clear he would prefer someone of the Barry Goldwater stripe.

"I haven't indicated any preference (for a presidential candidate)," Jordan said. "I hope he will be more on the conservative side, I like Senator Goldwater."

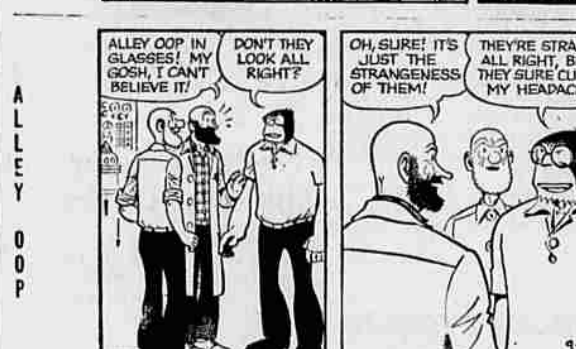
