

LA Dodgers Could Clinch Pennant During Weekend

Time will be the Los Angeles Dodgers' strongest ally and the St. Louis Cardinals' most deadly opponent tonight when they head into the final 10 days of the National League pennant race.

With the magic number for a Dodger pennant-clinching standing at five, the Dodgers open a three-game series with the Pittsburgh Pirates at Los Angeles while the Cardinals start a two-game set with the Reds at Cincinnati. A Dodger victory and a Cardinal loss tonight would reduce the magic number to three and mean Los Angeles could clinch as early as Sunday.

The Dodgers will send side-wheeling Don Drysdale to the mound tonight in quest of his 18th victory with the Pirates giving Don Cardwell (13-15) the assignment against him. The Dodgers hold an 11-4 season edge over the Pirates, who have lost four of their last six games.

The Cardinals, all but mathematically eliminated from the race when they lost three straight to the Dodgers in St. Louis, will open tonight with Ray Sadecki (10-8) or Ernie Broglio (16-8) on the mound opposing the Reds' John Tsitouris (10-8). The Cardinals have won only six of 13 previous games with the Reds this season.

Sophomore Braves Topple Joe Lane Pioneers 27-0

Coming on strong in the second half the Roseburg Sophomore Braves rolled to a 27-0 triumph over the Joseph Lane Pioneer ninth graders Wednesday at Jo Lane.

Chris Longfellow put the Braves on the scoreboard in the first quarter when he grabbed a pass from quarterback Steve Guthrie for the six-point. Dick Deitrich ran for the PAT. Later in the third period Guthrie capped a drive with a quarterback sneak for another TD.

In the final stanza the Sophomores added two more TDs as Eckman romped 35 yards to paydirt with a fumbled punt attempt and Gary Simms powered his way for a five yard touchdown run. A pass from Guthrie to Longfellow added the first PAT in the fourth quarter, and Bill Shermer ran for the final point.

The Braves displayed a spectacular passing attack with Guthrie handling the throwing and Larry Forrest and Longfellow shining on the receiving end.

The next game for the Sophomores is set for Sept. 26 when they meet the Roseburg Jayvees.

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Exactly a year ago, on Sept. 20, 1962, the Dodgers also held a four-game lead over the San Francisco Giants. The Dodgers stood 99-54 and the Giants were 95-58. The Dodgers then won only two of the last nine games while the Giants won six of their last nine to create a playoff in which San Francisco "stole the Dodger flag."

All practical considerations, however, favor the Dodgers. They play all their remaining games at home, they have Sandy Koufax at the height of his pitching brilliance this year whereas a year ago he was handicapped by a finger ailment that had sidelined him since July, and in Ron Perzanoski they have a peerless relief pitcher who still is strong despite 65 appearances so far this season.

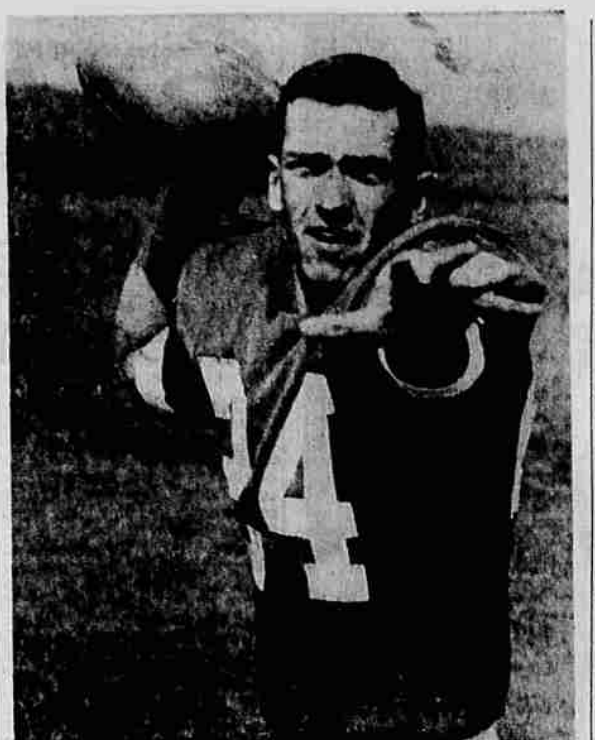

Indian Gridders Oppose Springfield 11 Tonight

Roseburg's Indians will unveil their power for the home fans tonight when they host the rugged Springfield Millers in a crucial Midwestern League gridiron test.

The Tribe rolled to a hard-fought 13-6 triumph in last week's opener over a spirited Willamette crew, while Springfield was played to a 7-7 deadlock by a determined Sheldon Irish team.

Tonight the Indians will be out to extend their league mark to two consecutive victories, while the Millers are gunning for an upset over the No. 5 ranked team in the state.

Springfield, like the Indians have a wealth of experienced lettermen back to take charge on the field, and also have plenty of weight.

The Millers sport 13 senior veterans and a pair of talented juniors—not to mention plenty of spirited newcomers.

Roseburg, on the other hand, have one of the biggest, roughest defensive lines in the state. The tight defense of the Indians is one of the main reasons they are picked to win their third straight Midwestern League (District 5-A-1) crown and rated among the top five teams in the state.

The only other league team to reach the select group of the top 10 teams in the Oregon Journal's coaches poll was the Cottage Grove Lions—rated ninth this week after their easy 33-13 triumph over the Marshfield Pirates.

While the majority of the emphasis will be on Roseburg where the Indians and Millers will be clanging at each other's throats, other league encounters tonight find Thurston at Cottage Grove, Marshfield and Sheldon meeting at Eugene's Civic Stadium, South Eugene at North Bend and North Eugene at Willamette. All league games tonight will start at 8.

Coach Roy Thompson will have the "Feroocious Four" in the forward wall on defense. The beef in this quartet is provided by tackles Doug DuFresne and Dennis Frank, 205 and 210 pounds respectively, and by guards Jesse Hart and Terry Rudolf, tipping the scales at 220 and 215 pounds.

Starting as defensive linebackers will be Dick Gwaltney, Dick Yost, Mike Leep and Vince Peetz, while Jerry Remick and Jon Burnham will work from the halfback spots. The defensive safety will be Dave Butler.

Offensively the Indians will be guided by quarterbacks Jim Beamer and Remick. The talented sig-

nal callers will be flanked by halfbacks Gwaltney and Ron Leep, with hard-charging Mike Leep throwing his 210-pound frame at the opposition from the fullback position.

The starting Roseburg offensive line will find Doug Matson and Gary Heeter at the end spots, Don Boerste and DuFresne working from the tackle positions, Bob Palmateer and Tom Thomas running from the guard slots and Peetz filling the center gap.

Bob Burgess at a halfback spot and Frank at fullback are scheduled to see plenty of action for the Indians on offense, while sophomore Alan Young will handle the punting and PAT attempts for the home team.

In the backfield will be quarterback Gary Bates, halfbacks John Thomas and Bryce Jensen and fullback Jim Parker—all veterans.

Defensively the Millers will add Dick Koer at an end spot and Ray Stewart at a halfback position, replacing Smith and Bates.

Grid Broadcasts Set

Roseburg area football fans will be able to hear the play-by-play radio broadcasts of the Roseburg-Springfield, Oregon-Penn State and Oregon State-Utah games this weekend.

The prep clash between the Indians and the visiting Springfield Millers will be carried by KQEN tonight, with the pre-game report starting approximately 15 minutes prior to the 8 o'clock kickoff time. Saturday night the Oregon State-Utah game will be broadcast on KQEN starting five minutes before the 8 p.m. game time at Salt Lake City.

The play-by-play of the Oregon-Penn State game will originate from Portland's Multnomah Stadium, with kick-off time set for 8 p.m. Saturday. KRNR will carry the broadcast locally.

The Millers will provide the Tribe linemen with a real test as they also pack plenty of weight. In the offensive line for Springfield will be ends Larry Johnson and David Wright, tackles Steve Smith and Curt Dickerson, guards Ron Reding and Jim Taylor and center Howard Robertson. Robertson is the heavy, weighing in at 209 pounds, while Taylor is 206 and Dickerson 198.

In the backfield will be quarterback Gary Bates, halfbacks John Thomas and Bryce Jensen and fullback Jim Parker—all veterans.
