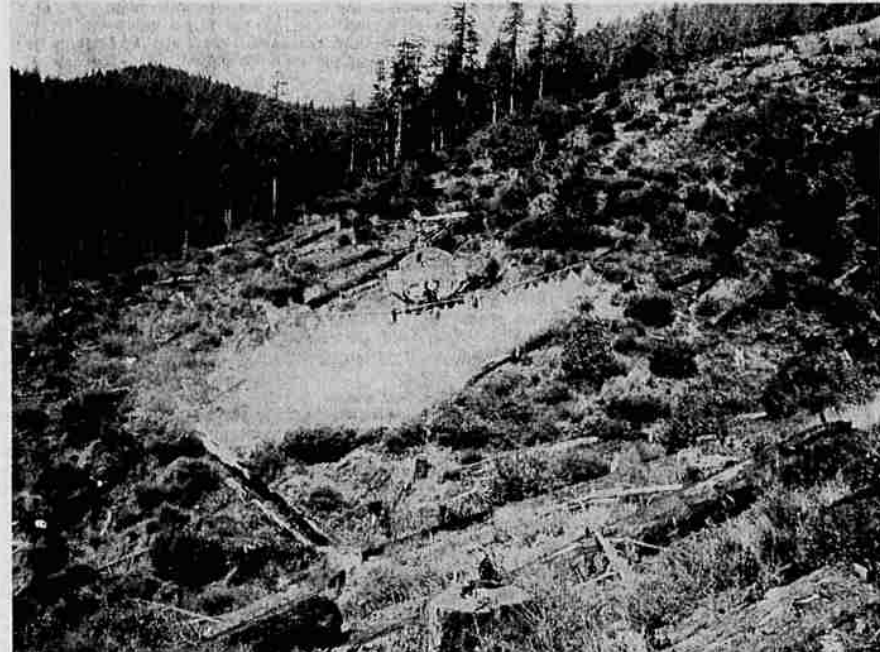

Helicopter Spraying Aids Forest Growth

Editor's Note: A helicopter spraying project was carried out recently on the Umpqua National Forest to destroy brush and provide new life and vigor for the forest's conifer trees.

The chemical, 2,4,5-T, acts swiftly to increase profitable production on the forest lands.

What lies behind this forestry program that brings death to encroaching brush and new life to a growing forest? Donald Darling, of the Umpqua National Forest staff, provides this answer in this article.

The forests that clothe the Northwest were a long time developing. In some areas devastating fires were followed by grass, brush and, finally, the old-growth forest as we know it. In other areas, where no fires occurred, huge monarchs of the forest were toppled by wind, throw and decay. In both cases, nature's leisure pace often permitted lands to be idle for years before new forests would rise to replace the old. A variety of brush, ferns and briars slowed the forest reproduction processes.

Just Like Crop
The farmer who tolerates weeds among his crops cannot prosper. For equally compelling economic reasons, foresters cannot tolerate idle forest land. The forest indus-

Lutheran Rites Sunday Launch Building Start

St. Paul's Lutheran Church will hold a ground breaking ceremony Sunday morning at its new church site adjacent to the Fremont Junior High School on W. Harvard Blvd. The service will begin at 11 o'clock in the cafeteria of the school.

After the sermon by the pastor of the congregation, the Rev. D. W. Hinrichs, the congregation will proceed to the building site. After the reading of a litany of consecration the ground will be broken by various officers of the congregation and by representatives of its organizations.

To dramatize the need of wholehearted support of the building project, the entire congregation will then break the ground by pulling a long rope attached to a walking plow. After the ground breaking ceremony the congregation will enjoy a potluck fellowship meal in the school cafeteria.

No worship service will be held at St. Paul's Lutheran Church this Sunday, but the Sunday school and adult Bible class will be held there at the usual 9:45 a.m. time. Construction of the first unit of the church plant by Todd Building Co. is expected to begin about Oct. 1. Included in the initial construction will be a fellowship hall, 10 Sunday school rooms, kitchen, heating plant and rest rooms, at a total cost of \$100,000. The sanctuary will be added later with a completion goal set by 1968, bringing the value of the total plant to around \$180,000.

Mac Said Ready For Ballot Now

LONDON (UPI) — Prime Minister Harold Macmillan now may be ready to gamble his political future on a parliamentary election this year, Minister of Health Enoch Powell indicated Friday night.

"You can expect the next election any day now," Powell told Conservative Party workers at Crewkerne.

Powell thus became the first high government official to hint openly that the Denning report on Britain's sex-and-security scandal is favorable and that Macmillan may decide not to wait until next year to call the elections. The election deadline is next fall.

Lord Denning has completed an exhaustive investigation into the circumstances surrounding the resignation of War Minister John Profumo earlier this year. Profumo resigned in disgrace after lying to the House of Commons about his "improper" relationship with call girl Christine Keeler.
