One Bid Gets Many Answers

Take a look at the South hand. Your partner opens one no-trump. You want to be in game and have considerable slam interest provided that your partner has good spades for you, at least two aces

cause no lead can hurt you as declarer. What do you do in the Jacoby system? You respond three spades. This tells your partner all these things and asks him to bid three no-trump with poor spades; four spades with good spades and a minimum 15-point no-trump or four of some other suit with good spades and a maximum 17-point no-trump.

Hence, North's four diamond rebid does not indicate that he wants to play diamonds, but confirms a near maximum no-trump with good spades.

This leaves South no problems at all. He uses Blackwood to check for aces and bids six spades after North shows two of those nice cards.

When South bids six spades he is not certain that the slam will be a laydown, but South knows that at worst a finesse will depend on a refuse to bid a slam under those circumstances.
