

Fulbright Says New Agreements With Russia Won't Come Soon

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. J. William Fulbright, D-Ark., said here it might take "two or three years" to develop any major new agreements with Russia as a sequel to the nuclear test ban treaty.

The chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, pleased with the 80-90 Senate vote approving the nuclear pact, emphasized that an early follow-up disarmament negotiations with the Soviet Union were unlikely.

Fulbright said that the treaty, which bans nuclear tests in the atmosphere, outer space and underwater, really was a "second step" toward peace with Russia

rather than a "first step" as advertised.

"Our ratification of the Antarctic Treaty with Russia was the 'first step,'" he told a reporter. "It wasn't considered significant at the time, but it has worked so far. And it had 21 votes against it in the Senate."

The vote on the Antarctic pact on Aug. 10, 1960, was 66-21, with 13 senators not voting. Eleven of the 21 who voted against it also voted against the test ban treaty Tuesday. But five who opposed the Antarctic Treaty voted for the test ban pact.

Will Take Time

Fulbright, like most adminis-

tration officials, said he would not expect any disarmament negotiations "very soon."

"I think we'll have to have a little experience with this first," he said. "It may take two or three years."

President Kennedy called the test ban treaty a "small but significant" step toward peace.

The President congratulated the Senate for its action and particularly commended "the painstaking work" of both Democratic and Republican leaders "in bringing the treaty to this highly satisfactory vote."

When the Senate voted, 102 nations had signed the pact agreed

on by the United States, Britain and Russia last summer. Red China and France, which aspire to their own nuclear forces, have indicated they will not sign it.

Rusk Holds Talks

Secretary of State Dean Rusk is holding talks in New York with Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko and other foreign officials to explore avenues of further agreement between East and West, including the possibility of stepped-up trade between this country and Russia.

Other possible steps that Rusk has listed include further agreements to reduce the danger of surprise attack; actual disarmament measures; reduction of the almost continual friction arising from a divided Germany and Berlin; increased flow of information and communication, and

joint U. S.-Soviet agricultural or scientific efforts. The Soviets have proposed a non-aggression pact between Western nations and the Communist Warsaw Pact nations.

Two Boys Placed In Priest's Home

OMAHA, Neb. (UPI) — Juvenile Court Judge Seward Hart Tuesday placed two Oregon boys sent here by their ill mother and out-of-work stepfather in the home of a pastor.

Hart said he placed Danny Presnell 12 and Ronald, 10, with the Rev. William Pounds because of the environment of Omaha youth center. There they were thrown into daily contact with youngsters being detained for delinquent acts, Hart said.

The Pounds have four children, all younger than Danny and Ronald.

Rev. Pounds is assistant pastor

of St. Andrews Episcopal Church. He said he discussing getting the boys started back in school with officials of school district 66.

Danny and Ray—both described as bright, alert youngsters—turned up here last Thursday. They carried 90 cents, an old suitcase, and a note from their mother, Mrs. Dudley Hackworth, Salem, Ore. She has since moved with her husband to North Bend, Ore., where he was seeking work as a longshoreman.

The note asked that Boys Town take in Danny and Ronald. Hart has set Oct. 9 for a hearing.

Trawler Gets Second Whale

ASTORIA (UPI) —The trawler Tom and Al brought in its second whale of the season Wednesday at the docks in Warrenton.

It was a 60-foot, 50-ton, finback. Last week it brought in a 66-foot finback.

Eben and Frank Parker, operators of the drag boat, said they got the whale Tuesday near the same spot where they bagged the one last week—about 50 miles west of Cape Falcon.



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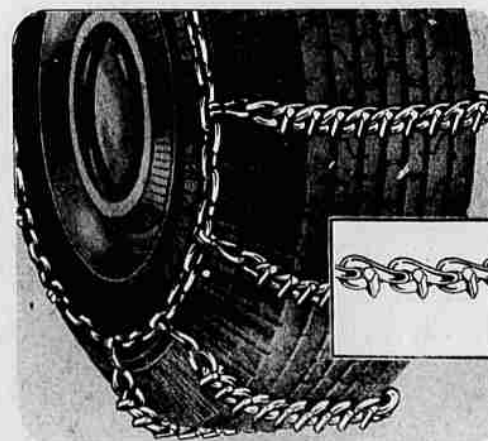
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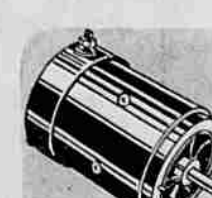
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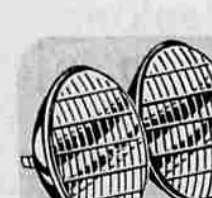
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
