The powerful Canyonville Tigers had a breather Friday afternoon on their home field while rumbling over Days Creek by an adding machine score of 73-0. The Tigers now have a perfect 3-0 record.

With Quarterback Mike Heath leading the way, the Tigers scored almost at will. By the third quarter, everyone on the Tiger bench had been in the game. Heath scored two touchdowns, passed to two more and scored six of the extra points.

Coach Dick Peterson had plenty of praise for him and for George Nuetzel. He also lauded John Carson for picking off no less than five Days Creek passes.

Canyonville left no doubt from the first that the game was going to be a runaway. It poked across four touchdowns in the first quarter and another four in the second. When the scoring had ended with three more in the fourth, the Tigers had racked up the biggest total for any team in the county this year.

Next Friday, the defending District eight-man champs take on Prospect at 3:30 on their home field.

Medford Storms Over N. Salem

Defending state Class A-1 foot-

ball champion Medford isn't through as a power—at least not in Oregon.

The rugged Black Tornado, ranked sixth in the Oregon Journal coaches' poll after a 25-0 loss at Boise, Idaho, last weekend, rebounded to smash top-rated North Salem 32-13 at Salem Friday night.

It was a replay of last year's state championship game.

Third-ranked Roseburg scored a 27-0 win over North Bend at Grants Pass and fourth-rated Grants Pass defeated South Salem 19-7 at Grants Pass and fifth-ranked Pendleton rolled past Madras 40-0 at Madras.

Central Catholic, rated seventh, was upset by David Douglas 13-7 at Douglas.

Ninth-ranked Cottage Grove won over Springfield 13-7 at Springfield. West Linn and Parkrose, rated in a tie for 10th, defeated Lake Oswego 28-13 at Lake Oswego and Sandy 39-7 at Parkrose.

Second-ranked Jefferson and eighth-ranked Grant met at Jefferson today.

John Leads CBA Harriers To Win
The Canyonville Bible Academy Pilots, rapidly rising to fame as one of the top A-2-B cross country powers in the state, topped the Rogue River Chieftains Friday in a meet at Canyonville.

Eddie John paced the CBA varsity to a decisive 19-39 victory over the Chieftains, while the CBA Jayvee harriers topped the Rogue River Varsity, 27-32, in the meet.

John covered the two and a half mile course in 13 minutes and 48 seconds to finish ahead of team-mate Bob Stanton, a sophomore, who was clocked at 14:07.

Beaver-Buff Tilt To Draw 20,000

PORTLAND (UPI) — Oregon State's Beavers, bitten by a flu bug earlier this week, and Colorado's Buffaloes, coming off a surprising season's opening performance, collide at Multnomah Stadium tonight.

A crowd of about 20,000 persons is expected for the football game, scheduled to start at 8 p.m. Oregon State, which stormed past Utah 29-14 at Salt Lake City in its campaign opener last weekend, had 30 players hit by a flu attack Tuesday night.

Session Light
The Beavers did not work out Wednesday but went through light practice sessions Thursday and Friday.

"You just can't tell," Oregon State Coach Tommy Prothro said when asked how much damage the mid-week virus did. "It's not like a knee injury or something like that which you can tell something definite about."

Colorado, listed as a 14-point underdog before the Beavers' flu attack, dropped a 14-0 decision to the powerful Southern California Trojans in its opener last weekend.

"They looked to be an awfully strong team defensively against Southern Cal last week," Prothro said.
