Brown Urges Fund To Rebuild Church

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (UPI) — Gov. Edmund G. Brown has urged 11 Western governors to serve as state chairmen of a fund to help rebuild the bombed Birmingham, Ala., church where four Negro girls were killed.

He said the rebuilt church would be a "monument to freedom, to equality and justice, telling the nation and the world that the bombers of Birmingham do not speak for us."

Jackie Arrives In Athens For 2-Week Private Visit

ATHENS, Greece (UPI) — Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy arrived in Athens today for a sunny and enthusiastic beginning to her two-week private visit to Greece.

The commercial jetliner carrying the First Lady from New York touched down at the airport at 2:25 p.m. (8:25 a.m. EDT). Greek police had closed off most of the airport and allowed only a few local people in to cheer her.

On hands were American and Greek officials to extend the official greetings.

Mrs. Kennedy's sister, Princess Lee Radziwill, is playing host during the stay. She said that Mrs. Kennedy's visit is for "a casual rest to have a change."

Wearing Black Suit
The weather was sunny and hot as the First Lady, dressed in a two-piece black suit, left the

Arrest Followed Announcement
The arrests of Cagle and Chambliss followed an announcement by the office of Gov. George Wallace in Montgomery Sunday night that arrests were "imminent."

The men underwent intensive questioning by state investigators, headed by Alabama Public Safety Director Al Lingo.

But the Rev. Fred Shuttlesworth, one of the leaders in the integration drive here, indicated dissatisfaction with the investigation.

Gets Special Gift
The pretty little girl, Chrysanthem Papakotski of Messina, underwent the operation at Walter Reed Hospital in Washington in February. Her mother had managed to get a note to Mrs. Kennedy in June, 1961, when the First Lady paid a visit to Greece.

Because of the note, Mrs. Kennedy had arranged for the operation to deal with aorta stenosis, constriction of the main artery.

After shaking hands with the chief of protocol of the foreign ministry, John Kountouriotis, Mrs. Kennedy entered the limousine with the U.S. ambassador and his wife and left for the seaside villa south of Athens where she will spend at least part of the vacation.

Cambridge, Md.: Voters rejected a public accommodations proposal Tuesday designed to end racial tensions in the city. A proposed amendment to the Cambridge city charter was defeated in a referendum by a 274-vote margin, 1,720 for to 1,995 against.

Princeton, N. J.: Twelve hundred Princeton students pushed and shoved their way into a packed hall Tuesday night to hear Mississippi Gov. Ross Barnett call civil rights legislation pending in Congress "A policeman's club." About 600 townspeople and students who could not get into Alexander Hall listened outside to Barnett's speech over loudspeakers.

Washington: President Kennedy Tuesday nominated Sportsworld W. Robinson II, a Richmond, Va., Negro lawyer who participated in the 1954 school desegregation case, to a federal judgeship in the District of Columbia.

Charlotte, N. C.: The nation must solve its current racial problems or be faced with a "tidal wave of crime and violence," an aide to Gov. Terry Sanford said Tuesday.

Atlanta: A federal court suit asking for an injunction against operation on a segregated basis of a new state vocational and trade school at Rome, Ga., was filed Tuesday by two Negroes.

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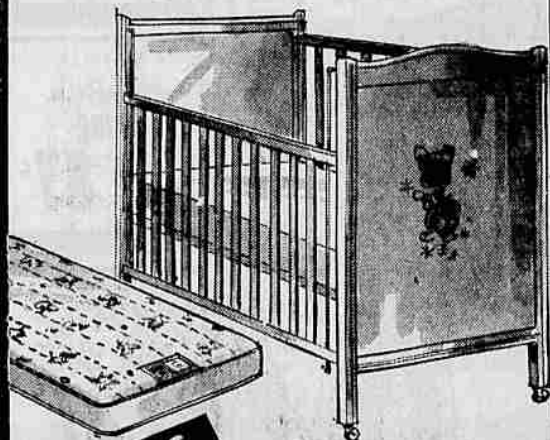
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
