Portland Buckaroos Seeking 3rd Consecutive WHL Title

PORTLAND (Special) — Every expert predicts that the 1963-64 Western Hockey League championship race will be the closest and toughest in history, and the Portland Buckaroos go after their third straight league title this week. The Buckaroos draw the honor of playing the first game in Denver, home of the league's newest franchise. Portland clashes with the Invaders in a single game in the "Mile High" city tonight. Then the Bucks return to the Glass Palace for their big home opener Sunday against the San Francisco Seals. Game time will be 7 p.m.

The Buckaroos edged the Seals in a torrid race for the Southern division championship last year but were eliminated by the San Francisco club in the semi-finals of the Lester Patrick Cup play-offs.

This has become a bitter rivalry and should start out where it left off last season with a thrilling contest. Both clubs are rated strong contenders in the streamlined six-club Western circuit.

Coach Hal Laycoe has made two important additions to his club. On the forward wall Pat Hannigan, a former first all-star in the WHL, replaces veteran Gordon Fashway. The former Buck captain has retired to become chief talent scout for the Portland organization.

The retirement of defenseman Bill Davidson leaves a big gap with the Bucks, but his place will be amply filled by a youngster in the Boston organization, Pat Stapleton, who was first all-star in the Eastern pro league last year.

A third retirement on last year's club was that of handy-man Doug Anderson. His place will be taken by a rookie, required under WHL rules which permit dressing 16 players this season. Most likely candidate is Dave Lucas, a rangy defenseman from Johnstown.

The rest of the Buckaroo lineup is much the same as the one which swept through the league with 92 points last year.

Don Head, the league's all-star goalkeeper, returns for his third full season in the nets.

Club officials expect a big turnout for the opener with the Seals. Reserved seats for the opener and future home games are available at the Coliseum box office and Portland Hockey Club, 510 SW Yamhill. General admission tickets will be sold at the Coliseum the day of the game only.

In Gerry Goyer, Art Jones and Ken Lauman the Buckaroos probably have the strongest set of centers in the league.

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Vital Conference Tests Scheduled For County A-2, B Football Teams

Crucial league counters are on tap this weekend for the various Douglas County A-2 and B football teams, as the races for the respective conference crowns begin to take shape.

In Umpqua Valley League play the featured game will be Saturday when the Douglas Trojans clash with the Glide Wildcats at Glide. Both teams boast perfect 1-0 league marks. Kickoff time is 2 p.m.

Friday's UVL counters finds Riddle's Irish at Myrtle Creek to meet the Vikings and the Sutherlin Bulldogs will travel to Glendale to face the Pirates. Both games will begin at 8 p.m.

Drain's Warriors are set to start on the comeback trail in Enead League action. Still smarting from their first loss of the season, the Warriors will be at Oakridge to face another contingent of Warriors at 8 p.m. Friday.

Bico-Trico B League play will find the undefeated Oakland Oaks

at Lowell for an 8 p.m. encounter with the Raiders Friday, while Monroe and Crow will square off at Crow in a 1:30 p.m. counter. Saturday the Yoncalla Eagles have a non-league outing on tap at Mapleton against the A-2 Sailors. Game time at Mapleton is 8 p.m.

In Southern Oregon Eight-Man League action the Prospect Cougars and the Camas Valley Hornets will clash at 1:30 p.m. Friday at Camas Valley, while the Days Creek Wolves will entertain the Canyonville Tigers on the Canyonville field at 3:30.

Douglas' Trojans, favored to capture the UVL crown this year, will face a tough test when they head for Glide Saturday to take on the rugged Wildcats. Both teams opened in league play last week with victories — Douglas downing Sutherlin, 26-7, and Glide upending defending champion Riddle, 7-0.

The Wildcats rely on a crunching defensive unit to stop their opponents, and exhibited a strong running game in defeating the Irish. Glide will be in action without the services of quarterback Wade Sumpter who is out for the season with a knee injury suffered against Riddle. Steve Anderson is expected to guide the Cats from the quarterback slot.

Douglas will be led by quarterback Dan Withers and the running of fullback Jim Heard. The defensive line for the Trojans has good weight and mobility, making it rough for the opponents to get through. Douglas has an overall season record of 3-1, while Glide had a 1-2-1 mark.

Myrtle Creek's Vikings opened in UVL play with a triumph over the Glendale Pirates, and will be out to make it two in a row when they host Riddle's Irish. The Irish, hurt by injuries, will still have Larry Ruckel, Gary Paetz and Tom Morrison to lead the charge. On the injured list is quarterback Mike Markham.

The Vikings boast a wicked aerial game, and are led on the ground by Bob Beamblossom and Ron Westbrook. Coach Gerald Hasset's crew started the season lacking experience, but has been showing improvement with each game and could emerge as a dark-horse contender in the UVL race.

At Glendale Friday night it will be the battle of the winless — the Pirates and the Sutherlin Bulldogs. Both teams suffered three consecutive defeats in warm-up games; and both dropped their opening league encounters. The Pirates boast a tough offensive unit led by Bill Hubler, but to date have had trouble with their defense. Sutherlin has an explosive attack featuring Don Goertzen and Mike Ouellette, but have not been able to come up with a consistent scoring punch.

Emerald League
Drain's Warriors, still smarting from last week's 12-8 defeat at the hands of the Junction City Tigers, will be out to get back on the victory train when they invade Oakridge. Drain is currently tied for second place in Emerald League play with a 3-1 record, and is the leading point-making team in the circuit. Leading the invading Warriors to battle will be Jerry Smith, Frank Backus and Mark Thomas.

Other Emerald League games this weekend includes a Friday clash between Harrisburg and Central Linn at Central Linn. Saturday games will find Junction City at Creswell, Elmira at Pleasant Hill and McKenzie will meet St. Francis at Eugene's Civic Stadium.

B Action Slated
The Oakland Oaks will invade Lowell with hopes of keeping their perfect Bico-Trico B League record intact. The Oaks boast a 2-0 record, and have a 4-0 mark for the season. The running of Kerney Manley, Keith Crenshaw and Jon Lamoreaux highlight the powerful Oaks attack which is guided by quarterback Randy Manley. Defensively the Oaks have a stubborn forward wall which makes up in aggressiveness what it lacks in weight.

The only other league game in the Bico-Trico circuit will find defending champion Monroe at Crow. Yoncalla's Eagles, running a close second to Oakland in league play with a 3-0-1 record, will be entertained at Mapleton by the Sailors. The Eagles have a well-balanced attack on offense, and boast one of the toughest defensive units in the state in B competition.

Elkton's Elks and Powers' Crusiers, members of the Bico-Trico B League, both have byes this week. In the Southern Oregon Eight-Man circuit all eyes will be on Camas Valley where the Hornets entertain the powerful Prospect Cougars. Both teams boast 1-0 league records and both are figured definite threats to replace the Canyonville Tigers as the league champs. The Hornets have good speed with Terry Volkman, Mike Priest and quarterback Terry Buel leading the charge.

Canyonville will open defense of its league crown against the Days Creek Wolves. The Tigers, led by Steve Gardner, Mike Heath and John Ringen sport a 3-1 record to date in non-league outings, with the lone setback being at the hands of Prospect. Days Creek, on the other hand, is winless in four games, and has a 0-2 league mark.

Oregon's Berry Fourth In NCAA Total Offense

NEW YORK (UPI) — Oregon quarterback Bob Berry is fourth in the nation in total offense, according to NCAA statistics released Wednesday.

Berry has gained 537 yards this season. Oregon State end Vern Burke is fourth in the scoring race with 26 points and Beaver halfback Charlie Shaw is sixth in rushing offense with 268 yards in 37 carries.

Another Oregon player in the top ten category is end Dick Imwalle, who is eighth in pass receptions with 11, good for 177 yards.

High-Powered UO Ducks To Face Improved Idaho Vandals Next

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene—High-powered Oregon, boasting offensive explosiveness and defensive toughness, makes its first Hayward Field football appearance of the season Saturday against Idaho.

Kick-off time for the meeting between the two longtime Northwest rivals is set for 1:30 p.m.

Coach Len Casanova's Webfoots will throw one of the nation's best attacks at the Vandals, who lost for the first time this fall last week to powerful Missouri.

The Oregon offense has clicked for close to a 1,000 yards total offense and has produced ten touchdowns in the two recent wins over Stanford and West Virginia.

Quarterback Bob Berry's pinpoint passing has been a highlight of the recent offensive binge and he'll be joined in the starting backfield by All-American halfback Mel Renfro and Larry Hill at halfbacks and either Lu Bain or Bill Youngmeyer at fullback.

The Vandals invade Eugene with a typically big, rough line and enough offensive firepower to give Oregon's tenacious defense a solid test. Up front, Idaho Coach Dee Andros points with pride to such performers as guards Don Matthews and Denny Almquist and tackles Max Letzow and Jim Morgan and on defense Dick Litzing, a brilliant linebacker, has drawn raves.

Gary Mires, a Baker, Ore. product, directs Idaho's Wing-T offense from his quarterback spot and calls on halfback Rich Naccarato and fullbacks Galen Rogers and Mickey Rice to supply the running punch.

Oregon will be shooting for its 12th straight win over the Vandals and Casanova will be out to keep his personal record of 11-0 against the Moscow crew untarnished.

Elks Billiards Team To Compete In Medford Meet
The Roseburg Elks billiard team will travel to Medford Friday to compete in the Southern Oregon Invitational Tournament sponsored by the Medford Elks.

Teams will be entered from San Francisco, San Jose, San Mateo and San Rafael, Calif., along with Oregon crews from Portland, Eugene, Klamath Falls, Ashland, Roseburg and Medford. The action will be for three-man team, with an individual championship playoff featured.

Roseburg's team will be composed of club champion Dick Stevenson playing the No. 1 spot, Verdon (Bo) Boucek shooting the No. 2 position, and Craig Short, holding down the No. 3 spot. Alternates will be John Bingham and Len Brower. Team manager and coach is Doss Burgess.

Friday's tournament will be the first time the Roseburg team has ever played against California crews, and Burgess reports that some rugged competition is expected. The San Mateo team is the current national Elks billiard champions.

Team games will be played to 30 points in the tournament, with individual matches in the singles championship being played to 35 points.

The action will get under way at 1 p.m. Friday, and will continue through late Sunday evening at both the Medford and Ashland lodges.
