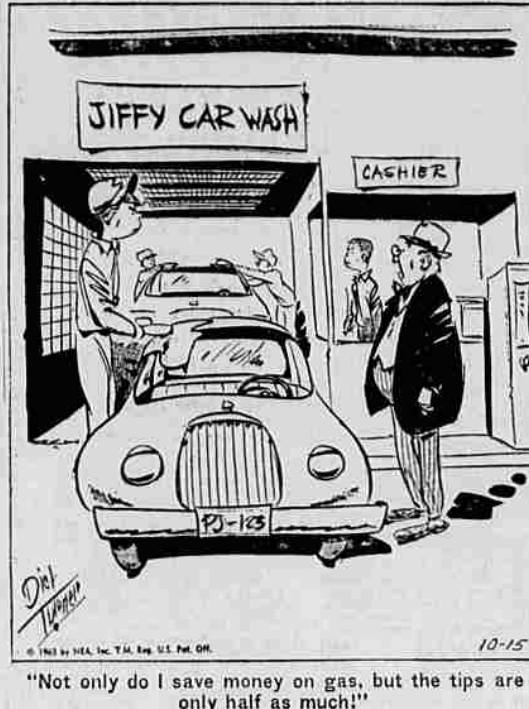

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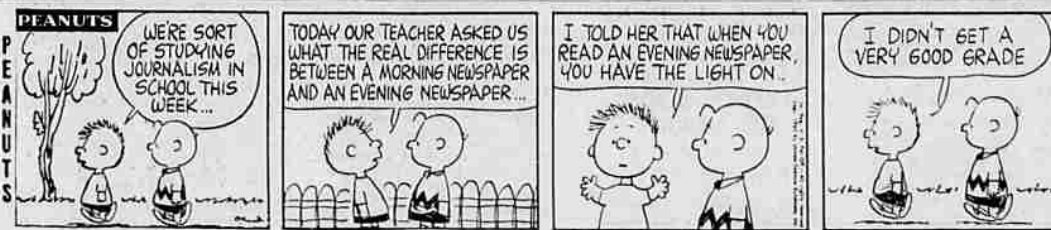
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## Defenders Make Bid Look Good

South won the jack of spades opening with the queen and led a heart to dummy's king. His next play was a low club to his jack whereupon he cashed his ace and dummy's king of clubs. West had to make a discard and he started his campaign to help South by letting the six of diamonds go.

South led dummy's three of diamonds and played low from his own hand. West was in with the queen and a simple play to set the hand two tricks would be to play the ace and another spade. The queen of hearts lead would have been even more effective and could have led to a three trick set, but West wasn't going to try any of those winning plays.

He went into a long huddle and eventually came up with the one losing play at his disposal. He led his low heart!

South won in dummy, played a low diamond and ducked. West took his ace, cashed his queen of hearts and finally had to lead a spade. This let South in to make his remaining diamonds.
