Instant was prominently mentioned as an All-America potential before the 1963 grid season started. But he broke a bone in his foot on Labor Day and has not been able to help Washington's Huskies so far in the current football campaign.

But Junior has been blasting away during practice sessions this week and the word is that Washington faithful will get to see their hero perform Saturday when the Huskies entertain Stanford here before an expected crowd of 55,000.

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Ram coach Harland Sware has given 6-foot-4 Roman Gabriel the quarterback assignment for the Los Angeles Coliseum tussle with the Minnesota Vikings.

Junking his system of the last few games of alternating quarterbacks, Sware decided on the former North Carolina State ace for the full route Sunday.

Although Gabriel is a second-year man with the Rams, his pro debut wasn't until the 10th game of the season against the Vikings. He connected on 15 of 24 pass attempts for 268 yards and two touchdowns, contributing to a 24-24 tie.

This will be the first time this season Gabriel will have called signals since a pre-season game in August—against the Vikings. The Rams lost that one 27-3.
