

Burgess Leading Runners; Heeter Is Best Receiver

Roseburg's Bob (Smokey) Burgess and Gary Heeter currently top the Midwestern League (District 5-A-1) in rushing and pass receiving respectively.

Burgess, power running speedster, upped his average to 10.4 yards-per-carry last week as he paced the Indians to a 34-6 victory over Thurston. The flashy junior halfback has now galloped for 375 yards on 36 carries.

Heeter, working from an end position, has pulled in 15 passes for 180 yards and three TDs. Heeter took over the lead from Cottage Grove's Chuck Olds in the pass receiving department last week. Olds has snared 14 passes for 270 yards and three TDs.

Going into tonight's showdown battle at Cottage Grove between the Indians and the Lions, the two teams dominate all brackets of the league statistics. Cottage Grove's rugged fullback, Alan Richards, has a total of over 400 yards in the total offense department. Richards has galloped for 808 yards on the ground and has added 44 yards passing for a grand total of 852 yards. Marshallfield's Jerry Burton ranks second with a total of 441 yards.

Mike Henningsgaard, talented Lion quarterback, heads the league in passing with 25 completions in 41 attempts for 392 yards and seven six-pointers. Henningsgaard boasts a .610 completion percentage. Jim Beamer, Roseburg's leading passer, ranks a close second to the Lion ace with 20 completions in 43 attempts. Beamer's completion percentage is .605, and he has gained 330 yards passing and tossed for five TDs.

Roseburg also has Mike Leep among the top 10 league rush-

ers. Mike Leep rates 10th with 276 yards for 58 carries. In the pass receiving Ron Leep is tied for ninth with nine receptions for 143 yards and four TDs.

Tonight's round of league action will be highlighted by the clash at Cottage Grove between the two undefeated conference teams — Roseburg and Cottage Grove. Other games on tap tonight will find North Bend and Thurston at Springfield's Silke Field, North Eugene and Sheldon at Eugene's Civic Stadium and Springfield will be at Willamette. Saturday the third place Marshallfield Pirates will take on South Eugene at Civic Stadium. All league games will start at 8 p.m.

KANSAS CITY Mo. (UPI) — Lewis and Clark took over 12th place in the NAIA, football poll Thursday after beating Linfield 21-7 last weekend.

Linfield, which had been in the top 10, fell out of the first 20, but was listed with 11 other teams which received votes.

Lewis and Clark, unbeaten in four games, was one of only four teams to receive a first-place vote in the poll this week. The others were top-ranked Texas A&M, second-ranked Florida A&M and third-ranked Northern Illinois.

Ducks, OSU Are Favored

Oregon and Oregon State go into Saturday afternoon football games as favorites, and if either one should fall on its face there'll be lots of people watching.

Oregon is rated a two-touchdown favorite over Arizona in a game that will be televised throughout the West from Tucson.

Oregon State has been made a 10-point favorite over Washington State in the OSU Homecoming game at Corvallis.

The Webfoots take a 3-1 record and the third-best total offense record in the nation against Arizona, but the Wildcats have speed and should be acclimated to the 92-degree temperature expected for the contest. Arizona has won two out of five contests this fall.

Quarterback Bob Berry goes into the game as the No. 3 man in the nation in total offense. He has gained 721 yards this season, more than anyone except Navy's Roger Staubach and Northwestern's Tom Myers.

At Corvallis, both the Beavers and the Cougars are looking for someone on which to take out the frustrations of last weekend. Oregon State had a 10-game winning streak snapped and took a 34-7 pasting from Washington. Washington State was upset 13-8 by San Jose State.

The Cougars boast one of the best runners in the Northwest in halfback Clarence Williams and the nation's No. 10 passer in Dave Mathison. End Dennis Kloe is the top pass receiver in the Big Six with 18 catches. If coach Jim Sutherland is planning an aerial game, he'll have to contend with Beaver defensive halfback Danny Espalino this week. Espalino was hurt and missed the Washington game.

Devine Is Top Executive In UPI '63 Baseball Poll

NEW YORK (UPI) — The 1963 major league baseball season of quiet heroes.

Sophisticated Sandy Koufax won National League pitcher of the year and major league comeback of the year honors. ... silent Walter Alston was voted the National League's manager of the year ... and now urban, retiring Vaughan (Bing) Devine is the United Press International's major league executive of the 1963 season.

Devine was voted the award today by 24 baseball experts

representing every city in the majors. He received 10 of the votes cast by the 24 experts with eight going to E. J. (Buzzie) Bavasi of the Los Angeles Dodgers and two each to John Quinn of the Philadelphia Phillies, Ed Short of the Chicago White Sox and Jim Campbell of the Detroit Tigers.

Remains In Background
Devine has been general manager of the St. Louis Cardinals since 1957 but there are still many baseball fans who wouldn't know him if they fell over him in the bleachers. That's partly because he insists on remaining in the background.

But he's a well-known G. M. to his brothers in the business — so much so, in fact, that many of them hesitate to answer the phone when they hear Bing is on the line to discuss trades. With good reason, too. Because the fact of the matter is that Devine's astute trades over the last six years have been largely instrumental in returning the Cardinals to their position as a pennant threat that they occupied in the glory years of the 1930's and 1940's.

Builds With Trades
To build the 1963 Cardinals, Devine used brilliant trading acumen to acquire second baseman Julian Javier and shortstop Dick Groat from the Pittsburgh Pirates, pitcher Ernie Broglio and first baseman Bill White from the Giants, outfielder Curt Flood from the Cincinnati Reds and outfielder George Altman from the Chicago Cubs. An organization man since 1939, Devine sees himself as the "balance wheel" — not the big wheel — of the Cardinal organization.

Indians, Lions Both Stand Undefeated Going Into Big Midwestern League Tilt

All the chips will be down tonight at Cottage Grove as the Roseburg Indians and the host Lions pull all stops in an attempt to gain undisputed control of the Midwestern League lead.

Both teams have racked up impressive 5-0 records, with the Indians currently rated as the No. 1 team in the state and the Lions holding down the No. 6 and 7 spots on the prep polls.

Roseburg has built its record at the expense of Willamette, 13-6, Springfield, 25-7, North Bend, 27-0, North Eugene, 12-0, and Thurston, 34-6. The Lions opened with a 33-13 setback of the Marshallfield Pirates, then topped Thurston 36-7, Springfield, 13-7, North Bend 27-14, and South Eugene, 21-13.

The two District 5-A-1 undefeated squads are nearly equal as far as offensive thrusts, with Cottage Grove having scored 120 points and the Indians having hit paydirt for 111. Defensively the Indians have the advantage to date, having allowed only three TDs, while the Lions have been nipped for eight six-pointers.

Both teams will be high for Friday's game, and a sell-out crowd is expected to jam the stadium at Cottage Grove for the crucial league encounter. Throughout the week the Indians have been concentrating on defense — with the main objective being to stop the Lions' hard-charging Alan Richards.

Richards, running from the left-halfback position as coach Al Simpson does not use a fullback, has rushed for 808 net yards on 105 carries for a 7.8 yards-per-carry average. In addition Richards has passed for 44 yards to lead the league in total offense with a whopping total of 852 yards in five games. Richards is also the league's top scorer with 72 points.

Roseburg sports two top running threats in the backfield in the form of speedster Bob Burgess and the power of Mike Leep. Burgess leads the league in rushing with 375 yards gained on 35 carries for an average of 10.4 yards-per-carry. The fleet junior has plenty of power to go with his speed and is expected to be a key in Roseburg's offense tonight.

Mike Leep, charging from the f-back position, uses his formidable 210 pound frame to power his way for yardage. Mike Leep has gained 276 yards on 58 carries and ranks as the 10th leading rusher in league

play. In addition, both teams sport deadly passing attacks. The Lions have veteran Mark Henningsgaard doing the throwing from his quarterback position. Henningsgaard leads the league in passing with 25 completions for 41 attempts, 392 yards and seven touchdown tosses. His favorite receiver is right end Charles Olds. Olds has pulled in 14 passes for 270 yards and three TDs to date.

Roseburg's top passer is quarterback Jim Beamer who has completed 26 of 43 attempts. However, Jerry Remick will be guiding the Indians as they clash with the Lions. Remick has completed seven of 11 pass attempts for 73 yards and will be holding down the starting quarterbacking spot for the second week in a row. Remick has been looking good throughout practice sessions all week on the ground as well as through the air.

Gary Heeter, left end for the Indians, is the top pass receiver in league play — having snared 15 aeriels for 180 yards and three TDs. In addition to Heeter, halfback Ron Leep has caught nine passes and leads the Tribe scoring with 24 points, and end Doug Matson has accounted for seven pass receptions.

Tonight's starting backfield for the Indians will find Remick calling the signals, with Ron Leep and Burgess running from the halfback spots. Mike Leep will be at fullback. In the offensive line the Tribe

(210) at the tackle spots, along with Jesse Hart (220) and Terry Rudolf (215) at the guard positions.

Roseburg's defensive linebacker, Dick Yost, Vince Peetz and Mike Leep. At the halfback spots will be Jon Burnham and Keith Olson, while Dave Butler will operate from the safety position.

The host Lions will have Henningsgaard serving as field general. He will be surrounded by left half Richards, right halfback Charles Darden and blocking back Bob Jeremiah.

Cottage Grove's line will find Olds and Bruce Hall at the end

spots, Walter Johnson and Greg Bronzon at the tackle holes, Tony Taylor and Gregg McKenzie at the guard gaps and Russell Harris playing center.

Defensively Jack Hayworth will replace Hall at an end position. Other boys will play different positions than when on offense, but the Lions go primarily with 12 players as lack of depth is their major weakness — if they can be said to have a weakness.

Deer Hunters Get Ready For Final Shot At Bucks

Oregon hunters are reminded that they have one more weekend of deer hunting during the 1963 general season. Sundown Oct. 20 will mark the end of this year's hunt. If hunters haven't killed their buck and don't have permits for the few extended hunts on the agenda, they'll have to hang the rifle on the mantle until next year.

Following the close of the general season a few hunters will still have an opportunity to score during the extended hunts scheduled for various dates in November. In all cases but one, unit permits are necessary to be eligible to hunt in these restricted areas.

The only hunt available for hunters with unused general season deer tags is the Willamette Agricultural hunt scheduled Nov. 2-5, 9-10, and 16-17. Bag limit is one deer, and hunters are restricted to, on or within one mile of agricultural lands down through the Willamette valley. Hunters are urged to check the regulations for open areas of this hunt.

Extended hunts for permit holders include the Ashwood Area, Nov. 9 and 10; Durkee, Nov. 30 through Dec. 8; Elkton Area, Nov. 30 through Dec. 8; Fort Rock Winter Range, Nov. 23-24; Gobbler's Knob, Nov. 16-17; Huntington, Dec. 7-15; McKenzie Unit, Nov. 23-24; Medical Springs, Dec. 14-22; Metolius Winter Range, Nov. 23-24; Northside Winter Range, Nov. 16-17; Pauline Winter Range, Nov. 30 and Dec. 1; Ramsey Creek, Nov. 30 and Dec. 1; The Dalles Orchard Area, Nov. 2-10; and the Walla Walla River, Nov. 16-17.

During all of the above-scheduled hunts, unit permits are required for the unit in which the hunt will be held. Interested hunters should check the regulations carefully not only to see if they are eligible but for boundary lines and other rules pertaining to these restricted hunts.

Another late deer hunt is also on the agenda, the Waldport-Mapleton area scheduled for

Nov. 23-24 and Nov. 30-Dec. 1. An early season was also held here with hunters restricted to buck hunting only. During the late hunt, holders of Waldport-Mapleton permits will be allowed to hunt deer of either sex. A few permits are still available for this hunt.
