Trust Department Of U.S. National Will Offer Forum

Karl's Shoe Store Moves To Temporary Location

Karl's Shoe Store is moving temporarily to the former Oerding Hardware Building at the intersection of SE Main St. at SE Washington Ave., while its location at 536 SE Jackson St. is being renovated.

The store building on Jackson, which also housed the Singer Sewing Machine Center adjoining to the south, was badly damaged by fire Oct. 13.

Lloyd Hastings, manager of the local Karl's store said it would take about 30 days to repair the fire damage and make other repairs to the building.

About 30 feet of floor area in this building was damaged and will have to be replaced. But, he said, the owner of the building S & S Realty of Los Angeles, will completely rebuild the interior.

All furnishings and fixtures will be removed, the walls ceiling and floor redone, then new fixtures installed. All new merchandise will be stocked, said Hastings.

The temporary location on Main St. will be open for business Thursday, with a fire sale on damaged merchandise.

The adjoining store in the same building which housed the Singer Sewing Center also will be completely done over. Fire damage to the building was extensive, especially in the rear portion. The blaze started in the basement and burned up into the main floor.
