

# Ten Oregon People Die In Accidents

Ten Oregon residents died during the weekend as a result of accidents. Eight of the deaths were recorded in the state.

James Cellars, 69 of Astoria, executive secretary of the Columbia River Packers Association, was killed Saturday in a one-car accident on U.S. Highway 101 about six miles south of Astoria.

Harry Saville, 38, Coos Bay, was accidentally shot and killed while deer hunting east of Reedport Saturday. He was the state's fourth deer hunting season gunshot fatality.

An Air Force man drowned Saturday after a 14-foot boat overturned near Brookings where the Chetco River flows into the Pacific.

The victim was S. Sgt. James Morelock, 30, who was stationed at Kingsley Air Force Base near Klamath Falls.

Two companions, Jerry Neilson, Klamath Falls, and Roy Brimm, Brookings, made it to shore. Neilson was rescued by the Coast Guard after another fisherman threw him a life-jacket and Grimm made it to shore by using a gasoline can as a float. Another small boat trying to help also turned over and the occupants were rescued

# Pope Paul Makes Dramatic Plea For Coexistence

VATICAN CITY (UPI)—Pope Paul VI, in a dramatic plea for co-existence between Catholicism and communism, Sunday called on Communist China to restore religious freedom to its people.

Addressing himself directly to government leaders in China, where the church has been totally suppressed, the Pope said that being a Catholic does not compromise a citizen's loyalty to his country.

"Belonging to the Church, rather than weakening, strengthens and increases the value of the relationship of citizens with their country," he said, "and makes of them the guarantors and participants in her security . . . and her true progress."

# Defeat Expected On Red China Bid For Seat in U.N.

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (UPI) — Communist China was expected to go down in defeat for the 14th time today in its bid to replace Nationalist China in the United Nations.

Communist Albania's resolution to seat the Peking regime was expected to come to a vote late in this afternoon's General Assembly session.

The United States, the leading supporter of President Chiang Kai-shek's Nationalists, was confident that Peking's 58-42 defeat last year would be repeated with an equal or larger margin.

As in previous years, the resolution goes beyond merely adding Communist China to the U.N. membership list. Since both regimes claim to represent the entire Chinese nation, it calls for the ouster of the Nationalists and their replacement by the Communists.

Victory for Peking could give it a powerful position on the Security Council as well as a place in the General Assembly and other U.N. organs. Nationalist China, a founding member of the United Nations, has one of the five permanent Security Council seats, which gives it the right of vetoing Security Council actions. The United States, France, Britain, and the Soviet Union are the other nations with veto power.
