Crunching defensive play by the Glide Wildcats resulted in costly Myrtle Creek fumbles Saturday as the host 'Cats romped to a 32-0 Umpqua Valley League victory.

The Wildcats broke into an early lead, capitalizing on a pair of first quarter Viking fumbles, then came on strong in the second half to outclass the visitors.

Recovering a Myrtle Creek fumble on the first play of the game after kicking off, the Wildcats marched 25 yards for the initial six points. Bob Paulson ripped off the final one yard to pay dirt.

Seconds later the Wildcats recovered another Viking fumble, this time on the Myrtle Creek 10-yard line. Two plays later Paulson again provided the power — this time smashing his way into the end zone from the four-yard marker.

The two teams then settled into a defensive battle for the remainder of the first half, with the intermission score favoring Glide, 12-0.

In the third quarter the Wildcats once again capitalized on a recovered fumble — falling on the ball on the Myrtle Creek 26. Dan Forrest rambled the final five yards for the TD and Paulson kicked the extra point.

Turning on the steam in the fourth quarter, the Wildcats added 13 points to their total. Speede Anderson scored on a

four-yard plunge and Craig Long rambled 42 yards with an intercepted pass. Paulson kicked the PAT after Anderson's TD.

The victory kept the Wildcats in the running for the UVL crown with a 2-1 record, while the Vikings now sport a 1-2 league mark. Glide and Riddle are tied for second place in the current standings behind the Douglas Trojans. The Trojans top the list with a 3-0 record.

In Saturday's battle, the Wildcats' defense gave the Vikings just 56 yards rushing and 65 yards passing. However, Myrtle Creek came up with a total of 12 first downs, while the winners had just seven. Myrtle Creek's passing yardage came on eight completions out of 26 attempts as the Vikings fumbled the air with footballs.

Glide gained 139 yards rushing and completed one of six passes for 27 yards. The Wildcats intercepted four Viking aeri

Each team lost three fumbles, but the Wildcats were able to capitalize on the Myrtle Creek miscues as they gained possession deep in the opposition's territory each time. Glide punted four times for an average of 30.2 yards-per-kick, while Myrtle Creek averaged 25.6 yards per kick on four punts. The Wildcats lost 25 yards on five penalties and the invaders were penalized five times for 35 yards.

## '49'ers, Rams Record NFL Upsets; Browns Win Again

Success came simultaneously Sunday to Lamar McHan, who was on the scrap-heap of pro football only three weeks ago, and to the San Francisco Forty Niners, the team that ransomed him for \$100.

McHan engineered the upset of the National Football League season in directing the Forty Niners to a stunning 20-14 victory that knocked the Chicago Bears from the undefeated ranks and threw the NFL's Western Division race into a tie.

This was the Forty Niners' first triumph of the season and no team in the league cheered it more enthusiastically than McHan's old team mates, the Green Bay Packers. By drubbing the St. Louis Cardinals, 30-7, the Packers moved into a first-place tie with the Bears. Green Bay and Chicago both have 5-1 records.

In the Eastern Division, there was no stopping the Cleveland Browns as they defeated the Philadelphia Eagles, 31-7, for a spotless 5-0 record. The New York Giants remained two games behind the lead by beating the Dallas Cowboys, 37-21.

# Oregon Drops Arizona; Beavers Upend Cougars

**EUGENE (UPI)** — Oregon's offensive-minded Ducks began getting ready for Washington today following their 28-12 football victory over Arizona on Tucson Saturday.

The Ducks, who now have a 4-1 record for the season, and the Huskies, who own a 2-3 mark, collide at Portland's Multnomah Stadium next Saturday.

Quarterback Bob Berry and All-American halfback Mel Renfro sparked Oregon to its regionally televised win over the Wildcats.

Berry completed 13 of 18 pass attempts for 190 yards including a 19-yard touchdown aerial

to end Rich Schwab. Renfro gained 113 yards in 12 carries including a 3-yard scoring run and also caught three passes for 24 yards.

**Cas Praises Both**  
"Berry did a tremendous job, particularly in picking the Arizona defense apart," Oregon Coach Len Casanova said.

He added "Renfro, of course, played a great game."

Coach Jim LaRue of Wildcats also had high praise for the two stars of the Ducks.

"Berry was the big factor against us," he said. "He's just a real quarterback. He handles the ball well and he takes advantage of everything you give him."

"Don't ask me to choose between Renfro and Berry. I'd take either one and count my blessings."

Oregon ran up a 14-0 half-time lead on the touchdowns by Schwab and Renfro. The Ducks went ahead 28-0 on a 3-yard scoring run by fullback L. U. Bain in the third period and a 1-yard touchdown plunge by Berry in the fourth period.

Arizona collected its touchdowns in the final period against Oregon reserves.

**Receivers Shine**  
"Our receivers won the game for us," Coach Tommy Prothro said after his Oregon State Beavers posted a 30-6 Homecoming football win over Washington State Saturday.

Specifically, Prothro referred to star end Vern Burke, who caught touchdown passes of 8 and 21 yards from quarterback Gordon Queen.

"I've never seen anybody who can get open like he does," he said. "He gave us the opportunity to run more of our other plays."

Burke, who set NCAA records by catching 69 passes for 1,007 yards last season, caught six passes for 78 yards. He has 19

catches for 308 yards and six touchdowns this season.

**Cougars Hold Lead**  
The Cougars took a 6-0 lead in the first period on a 1-yard touchdown plunge by sophomore fullback Larry Eilmes. But the Beavers went ahead 16-6 at halftime on Burke's scoring catches and on a 33-yard field goal by Steve Clark in the second period.

Oregon State dominated the second half, collecting touchdowns on a 1-yard run by fullback Bruce Williams in the third period and on a 16-yard pass from Queen to halfback Danny Espalin in the fourth period.

The Beavers gained 18 first downs to 14 for the Cougars and held a 346-210 edge in total yardage.

Washington State Coach Jim Sutherland saw it this way: "They just knocked us down and ran over us. In the second half, Oregon State beat us physically at the line of scrimmage. They outmanned us."

The game left Oregon State 4-1 and the Cougars 1-3-1 for the season.

The Beavers meet powerful Syracuse next Saturday at Syracuse. Washington State is at Army.

## Ford Seeking Lion Franchise

**DETROIT (UPI)** — Industrialist William Clay Ford, admitting the morale of the Detroit Lions is sagging but insisting the dawn of a better day is near, today said he's confident that his \$6 million offer to buy the club will be accepted.

Ford, 38, the youngest of the three brothers who inherited the vast Ford Motor Co. empire and Lion president since 1961, said, "I can't be certain the offer will be accepted but I don't see any roadblocks."

Ford, a devoted pro football fan, said the club has a bright future despite a disappointing 2-3 record this season and reports of dissension among the players.

"Sure the Lion morale is down, but I'm not down on them, not by a long shot. They've had a lot of things go wrong and they don't have much left to fight for this year," Ford said.

He added, "but I wouldn't have made this offer if I didn't think it was a lucrative franchise that will make money."

The Lions lost \$180,000 when they won the world title in 1955 in their second year in Detroit but last year earned \$440,268.53 before taxes and \$220,268.53 after taxes while finishing second in the Western Division.

Ford set an Oct. 29 deadline for the Lions board to accept his offer to buy out all 144 stockholders. If it is accepted, the next move would be a vote by stockholders.

If they approve, the sale will be completed in January of next year after the close of the NFL season.

## Top Rated Texas Wins, 17-13

Texas, charging along to what could be its greatest season ever, will be out to attend to some unfinished business next week.

The Longhorns were unbeaten in regular-season play last year but had the record marred by a 14-14 tie with Rice (3-1). Texas has won its first five games of the 1963 season and now must face another tough Rice team on Saturday.
