# USC Upsets Ohio State; UW Tops Tribe

Get that quarterback!  
They're dominating the West Coast football scene today and it will be a battle to pick the best in the area when the season ends.  
How about Southern California's Pete Beathard who came into his own at last Saturday and led the Trojans to a 32-3 upset of fourth ranked Ohio State?  
Or California's Craig Morton, whose five touchdown passes set a school mark and led the Bears to a 34-13 blitzing of San Jose State?  
Then there's Gordon Queen, Terry Baker's successor at Oregon State, who found the key after some groping and threw three TD's in the Beavers' 30-6 rout of Washington State.  
Quarterback Bill Douglas connected on two touchdown passes

to get Washington past hard luck Stanford, 19-11 on the 4th straight loss for the Indians who are dying because their top signal caller is out for the year. And Bob Berry, Oregon's sharp quarterback, gained 190 yards passing as he directed the Ducks to a 28-12 win over Arizona.  
It will be Beathard versus Morton next Saturday when Southern Cal comes to Berkeley to open defense of its Big Six title against California.  
In other games, Notre Dame's Irish—who have uncovered a hot quarterback of their own in Frank Budka—will be at Stanford favored to hand the Indians their fifth straight loss. The rest of the slate features Illinois at UCLA Friday, Washington at Army, Oregon State at Syracuse, San Jose State at Idaho and the

University of the Pacific at Utah State.  
Saturday's highlights:  
Dick Van Raapborst's 44 yard field goal gave Ohio State a brief lead over Southern California. Then Beathard got his team on the beam and Willie Brown's 49 yard touchdown run put USC ahead for keeps. Beathard also scored a TD from the one and passed 33 yards to John Thomas for another. Southern Cal picked up 18 first downs to the Buckeyes' three.  
California's Morton connected on a 67-yard bomb to old playmate Jack Schraub in the 2nd period to crack a 7-7 tie and start Cal toward its win over San Jose State. Morton also hit on two 49-yard scoring passes and one each from the 18 and nine yard stripes.

Douglas and end Jake Kupp of Washington twice hooked up for scoring passes within five plays as the Huskies downed Stanford, 19-11. The Indians scored with three minutes to play but the touchdown was killed when they were penalized 15 yards for interference on the pass.  
Idaho belted UOP, 64-6, to beat the de-clawed Tigers the first time in the eight games they have played.  
By the way, another quarterback named Beau Carter passed 33 yards for one touchdown and

scored another to spark Fresno State to a 28-0 win over Cal Poly of San Luis Obispo.

Marshfield's Pirates stayed in the thick of the Midwestern League title chase Saturday by bombing the host South Eugene Axemen, 33-7.

The victory was the fifth in a row for the rampaging Pirates who have not suffered a defeat since losing their opener to Cottage Grove. Marshfield now sports a 3-1 record in District 5-A-1 competition, and rests in a tie for second place with Cottage Grove. The Roseburg Indians lead the league with an unscathed 6-0 mark.

Jerry Button placed the Marshfield 11 to the crucial win Saturday, giving the Pirates a 13-0 lead in the first quarter with TD runs of eight and one yard. Dennis Parrish's 66-yard jaunt in the second quarter sent the invaders out in front by a comfortable 20-0 halftime advantage.

This week's Midwestern League schedule finds South Eugene at Roseburg, Marshfield at Springfield, Willamette at North Bend and Thurston playing North Eugene at Eugene's Civic Stadium in Friday night battles. Saturday Cottage Grove and Sheldon will play at Civic Stadium in Eugene.

A showdown battle between the Indians and the Pirates is slated for the Marshfield turf Nov. 2.

**Rote's Passing Leads Chargers**

Tobin Rote, a quarterback who loves to throw "the big bomb," fired a couple Sunday that made the Western Division of the American Football League a "disaster area."  
At the same time the 14-year veteran of pro football all but clinched an AFL playoff berth for the San Diego Chargers and made Sid Gillman a strong candidate for coach of the year honors.

The 35-year-old Rote, a former star with the Green Bay Packers and Detroit Lions in the National Football League and the Toronto Argonauts in the Canadian Football League, completed 15 of 22 passes for 266 yards and two touchdowns Sunday to lead the Chargers to a 38-17 victory over the Kansas City Chiefs. The win gave the Chargers a 5-1 season record and a 2½-game stranglehold on first place at the halfway mark of the schedule.

The Eastern Division race was thrown into a turmoil, meanwhile, when the Houston Oilers defeated the Buffalo Bills, 28-14, and the Oakland Raiders whipped the New York Jets, 49-28.

The Oilers are now tied for first place with the Boston Patriots, who beat the Denver Broncos, 40-21, Friday night, with the Jets a half-game behind them. Houston and Boston are 4-3 each and New York is 3-3.

George Blanda threw touchdown passes of 8, 20 and 80 yards for the Oilers, who struck for three touchdowns in the second period after a scoreless first session. Jack Kemp produced both Buffalo scores on passes of four yards to Bill Miller and 55 to Ernie Warwick.
