Rampaging Huskies Nip Ducks, 26-19

EUGENE (UPI)—Battered Oregon began getting ready for its football game with San Jose State here next Saturday — minus All-American halfback Mel Renfro, quarterback Bob Berry and tackle Milt Kanehe. The three starting players were injured as the Ducks dropped a 25-19 decision to Washington before 35,690 in Portland Saturday.

Kanehe, a 6-3, 250-pound senior, suffered a fractured right ankle and probably will not be able to play in any of Oregon's four regular season games.

Renfro and Berry were listed as "doubtful" for the Ducks' next contest. Renfro received bad bruises on his right side and Berry suffered strained ligaments in his right knee. They were scheduled to undergo further examinations today.

Fullback Junior Coffey, starting his first game of the season, sparked the Huskies' win over the Ducks. He ran for 110 yards in 30 carries including touchdown bursts of 1 and 4 yards.

NY Giants Upend Cleveland Browns

The New York Giants found a way of living with Jimmy Brown and the Green Bay Packers found a way of winning without Bart Starr. And suddenly the National Football League races are tighter than a pair of \$5 shoes.

The Giants brought Jimmy and the Browns crashing to the earth in more ways than one — with a 33-6 beating Sunday, while the Starr-less Packers had to score two touchdowns in the final period for a 34-20 triumph over the Baltimore Colts. It was Cleveland's first defeat in seven games.

This was one of the most miserable afternoons Jimmy Brown has spent in seven NFL seasons. He fumbled on the third play of the game to set up New York's first score; gained only 40 rushing yards in nine carries; and wound up being ejected for the first time in his career after a pummeling and wrestling match with linebacker Tom Scott of the Giants during the final minute. Scott also was ejected.

By winning, the Packers managed to remain tied for the Western Division lead with the Chicago Bears, who defeated the Philadelphia Eagles, 16-7. Both Green Bay and Chicago have 6-1 records.

The Giants' surprise win narrowed Cleveland's Eastern Division lead to one game and also permitted the St. Louis Cardinals to get back into close contention with a 21-7 victory over the Washington Redskins. Cleveland has a 6-1 record; New York and St. Louis are 5-2.

In Sunday's other games, Pittsburgh defeated Dallas 27-21, Detroit beat Minnesota 28-10 and Los Angeles, behind Roman Gabriel, defeated San Francisco 28-21.

Portland Named Site Of Regional NCAA Indoor Track-Field Meet

UNIVERSITY OF PORTLAND, Portland — When the NCAA launches its regional indoor track and field championships this winter, Portland will be the site of the western championships.

Under the sponsorship of the University of Portland, an NCAA member school, the inaugural championship indoor meet at the Memorial Coliseum, Feb. 29, will draw many of the nation's top athletes, many of whom will represent

the United States in the Olympic Games at Tokyo next October.

The Western Indoor Championships — the NCAA will also stage — an Eastern Indoor Championship in Louisville, Ky. the same weekend — could have easily been called the national finals if last spring's outdoor title meet at Albuquerque, N. Mex., provides a true picture of collegiate power.

In that meet, nine of the top 11 finishers in team results came to the western regional area. All will be represented in Portland including (1) Southern California, (2) Stanford, (3) Oregon, (4) Arizona State, and (6) Oregon State.

Each event will be loaded with point winners from the Albuquerque meet. Broad jumpers Phil Shinnock, Washington's "wind-blown" 27-4 ace, and Sid Nicholas, Fresno State's 23-8 1/2-

performer, will be on hand as will a pair of 7-foot high jumpers in NCAA champ Lew Hoyt, USC, and Paul Stuber, Oregon.

Outstanding Stanford sprinter Larry Questad, NCAA dash king plus other Indian runners Henry McCalla, Weyn Kirkland and Paul Schlicke are expected as well as Arizona State's crack mile relay team which boasts Ullis Williams and Henry Carr.

Oregon and Oregon State will furnish top candidates with Webfoots Dave Blunt, 100; Ray Van Asten, 800 and Archie San Romani, mile, here while States Jan Underwood, 800, and distances stars Morgan Groth and Dale Story will be on tap. Emporia State's John Camien, mile, and Abilene Christian's versatile Jerry Dyess are other top nationally-known candidates.

Trout Anglers Get New Lakes

If all goes well with clean-up now in progress, Oregon anglers will have a new lake next spring in which to test their trout angling skill.

Phil Schneider, state game director, advised fishermen that construction of Canyon Creek Meadows, 31-acre impoundment south of John Day in the Malheur national forest, is now complete except for slash clearing around the perimeter of the site. This work should be completed within the next month, at which time the gates will be closed and the reservoir filled.

Schneider said that if possible Canyon Creek would be stocked with trout this fall before weather blocks access to the site. If not, trout destined for the impoundment will be held at game commission hatcheries through the winter and planted when the season opens next spring. In either event, the planting should get the sport fishery off to a rousing start next summer.

Canyon Creek Meadows is the 4th impoundment built by the game commission strictly for angling purposes under its lake building program. Others include 60-acre Trillium Lake near Mt. Hood, 23-acre Bull Prairie in the Umatilla national forest south of Heppner, and 40-acre Cottonwood Meadows in the Fremont national forest west of Lakeview. These impoundments are already producing excellent trout angling to Oregon fishermen.

In addition, Oregon anglers are partners in the development of three other major impoundments where they enjoy the fishing rights through perpetual easement. These include 41-acre Lofton reservoir in Lake County, 32-acre Rowe Creek reservoir near Mitchell in Wheeler county, and the 5-acre Bibby Pond near Moro in Sherman county. At each of these irrigation reservoirs Oregon anglers have invested funds to protect the fishery and the privilege of angling.
