Cottage Grove's Lions kept their Midwestern League title hopes alive with a come-from-behind victory over the North Eugene Highlanders, 20-14, Friday.

The Lions, spotting the Highlanders 14 points in the first quarter, moved to within one point of the invaders by half-time, then scored a fourth quarter TD to grab the victory.

Cottage Grove capitalized on

long scoring plays to stay within one game of league-leading Roseburg. The Lions picked up TDs on a 52-yard run by Alan Richards and passes of 48 and 52 yards from Mark Henningsgaard to Chuck Olds.

The spotlight in league play will be on Coos Bay tonight where the high-riding Indians will be meeting the Marshfield Pirates. Marshfield boasts a 6-1 record, while the Tribe has posted seven straight triumphs to head the league. A Roseburg loss could result in a three-way first place tie for the league crown as Cottage Grove now boasts a 7-1 mark.

In other action Friday the North Bend Bulldogs took a firm hold on fourth place with a 28-13 win over Springfield. Ken Snoddy scored three touchdowns and kicked four extra points in leading the Bulldogs.

Special Hunt Starts Today

Oregon deer hunters with unused deer tags have three weeks ended in November in which to try their luck for deer. This opportunity is the Northwest Agricultural deer hunt scheduled for Nov. 2-3, 9-10 and 16-17.

Hunters are reminded that this hunt is designed to alleviate agricultural damage in the Willamette Valley, and in the main, hunters are restricted to hunting on or within one mile of established agricultural lands.

Open areas for this hunt include the area on or within one mile of cultivated agricultural lands in Benton, Clackamas, Lincoln, Linn, Polk, Washington, Marion and Yamhill counties; or on within one mile of cultivated agricultural lands in that portion of Columbia county east of Highway 47; and on or within one mile of cultivated agricultural lands in that portion of Lane County east of the Coast Range summit. The McDonald Forest-Adair Tract and the Corvallis Watershed are also open to their entirety.

Hunters in Lane County are urged to be careful about staying east of the summit of the Coast Range. If they are hunting on agricultural lands or stream drainages flowing east into the Willamette, they can be sure they are within the bounds of the agricultural hunting area.

Established agricultural lands are lands of not less than 10 acres in extent that have been plowed, tilled, and planted to domestic crops and are currently in use. Areas adjacent to isolated home gardens and abandoned farmsteads are not included.

License requirements include a general hunting license and unused deer tag. Hunters may take either-sex deer.

In class A-2 competition, Brookings virtually collected the Sunset League title with a 26-0 win over Bandon.

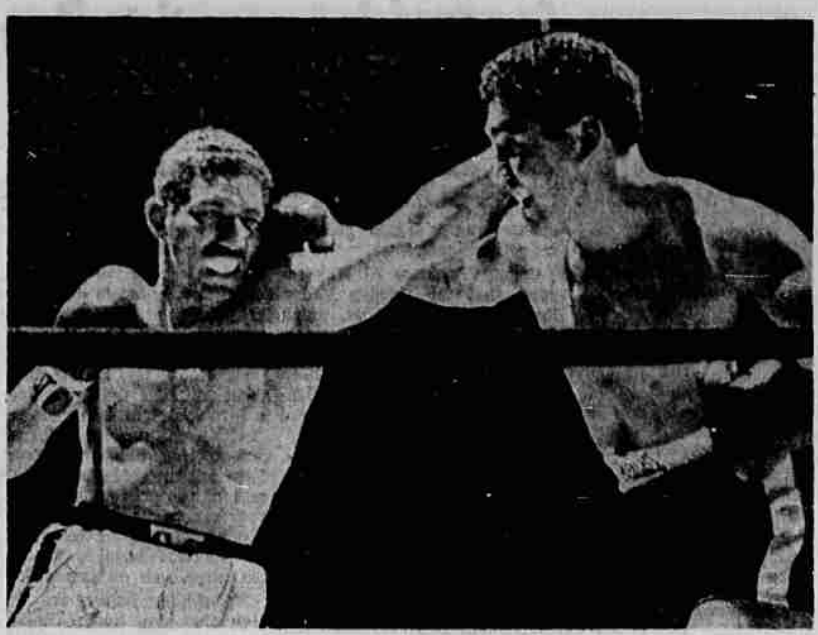

Boston Patriots Blast Houston 45-3 To Throw AFL Race Into Tight Spot

At the rate it's going, the American Football league will have to run a whole series of preliminaries before it can stage a championship playoff.

The circuit's Eastern Division got tighter than a sticking wound in a thunderstorm Friday night when Boston routed Houston 45-3.

That runaway victory by a team rated a three-point underdog tied the two clubs for the top in the East. That condition could get even more complicated if New York and Buffalo can win in other games this weekend.

In fact, victories by the Jets and Bills would leave the four Eastern clubs bunched within the equivalent of a half game.

Jets Underdogs
The Jets, who gave the Chargers a rugged game before losing, 24-20 at San Diego were six-point underdogs for their Saturday night game in New York. Sunday's odds list made Oakland a six-point choice over Kansas City while Buffalo at Denver was rated a toss-up.

Boston's rainwashed victory before 31,185 at Fenway Park Friday night was the biggest on record for the Patriots, and the worst licking Houston has suffered in its 54-game AFL history.

While the Patriots were specialists limited the Oilers to climbing all over Houston old 19 yards rushing and intercepting George Blanda, Boston veteran Babe Parilli was having a field day.

Though not noted for his running, Parilli scored touchdowns on runs of one and three yards. One of his four pass completions in the game was to Larry Garrison for 76 yards and a touchdown.

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — A pair of teams going nowhere except to the hospital — the Detroit Lions and San Francisco Forty Niners — meet Sunday in a National Football League convention of Western Division poor paupers.

The Lions, 3 - 4 for the season, have lost such backfield names as Ollie Matson, Nick Pietrosante, Larry Ferguson and star linebacker Joe Schmidt to injuries.

The Forty Niners, losers of six out of seven, saw two key defense - men undergo surgery during the week for knee injuries. They are Charley Krueger, the team's best play-buster, and rookie Walter Rock. Both are deemed through for the year.

Krueger became the fourth Forty Niner to have a knee operation this season. His spot will be taken by the 39-year-old Leo Nomellini who is entering his 168th consecutive pro game. In 13 years of play-for-pay football, Nom's worst injury has been a sprained ankle.

Coach Jack Christiansen, whose Forty Niners upset the Chicago Bears two weeks ago, is getting his second crack at the Lions for whom he once starred on defense.

His old club, a six - point favorite, initiated him into the head coaching fraternity with a 26 - 3 lacing last October 6 after he had replaced Red Hickey as top man.

During the game, Detroit's Tommy Watkins demolished two punt return records that Christiansen had set in other years for the Lions.

EUGENE (UPI) —The unbeaten Oregon Ducks exploded for three touchdowns in the second period and went on to post a 30-6 football win over the Washington Pups Friday afternoon.

The decision gave the Ducks a 3-0 record and the Pups an 0-2 mark.

Fullback Doug Giles ran 5 yards, halfback Phil Johnson went 11 yards and quarterback Tom Jernstedt ran 5 yards for Oregon touchdowns in the second period.

End Bill Payne's 33-yard field goal in the first period and halfback Tim Temple's 94-yard kick-off return for a touchdown in the third period gave the Ducks their other points.

Washington scored in the final period on a 14-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Tom Greenlee to end Dave Williams.

Oregon rolled up a 15-7 edge in first downs and a 242-154 margin in total yardage.

Jernstedt completed 8 of 16 passes for 93 yards and ran 28 yards in seven carries. End Steve Bunker caught five passes for 49 yards for the winners.

Rams Take On Viks Sunday

MINNEAPOLIS (UPI) — The Los Angeles Rams and the Minnesota Vikings, tied for fifth place in the National Football League's Western Conference, meet Sunday in what would appear to be a "bottle of the walking wounded," according to rival coaches.

Both teams have been using liniment and bandages on a wholesale scale but many of the casualties will suit up and play.

Minnesota appears to be hardest hit with injuries. Offensive end Ray Poage is in the hospital and halfback Tommy Mason is out with a bad leg.

End Leon Clarke, a former Ram, has been sidelined for the season.

The Rams have a variety of minor ills. Lamar Lundy has a bad shoulder; Rosey Grier and Charley Britt have jammed fingers; Jon Arnett has a twisted knee; and Dick Bass has a heel bruise.

Roman Gabriel, the second-year quarterback who steered the Rams to a 27 - 24 win over the Vikings three weeks ago in Los Angeles and then to a 28-21 victory over the San Francisco Forty Niners last Sunday, will be at the helm again.

Both teams are 5-2 on the season and hope to break out of the deadlock for fifth place.

This is the first game of a three - game road - trip for the Rams.
