IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR DOUGLAS COUNTY ORDER

In the Matter of the Establishment of North Umpqua Sanitary District.

The matter of the establishment of the North Umpqua Sanitary District of Douglas County, Oregon, coming on for hearing on May 21, 1963 upon a petition duly filed with the County Court of Douglas County, Oregon, containing fifty citizens signatures, all of whom were legal voters of the State of Oregon, County of Douglas, and residents of the North Umpqua Sanitary District, and the County Court of Douglas County, Oregon, proposed for said sanitary district, and

It further appearing that notice of the time when said petition would be presented to the County Court was duly published once each week for three successive weeks in the Roseburg News-Review, a newspaper of general circulation and published in Douglas County, Oregon, said notice being published April 27, 1963, May 4, 1963 and May 11, 1963; and

It further appearing from the records on file in the County Court of Douglas County, Oregon, that on May 21, 1963 before the County Court of Douglas County, Oregon, the matter of the establishment of the North Umpqua Sanitary District was duly heard and the County Court of Douglas County, Oregon, proposed for said sanitary district, and

It further appearing that no lands which would be benefited by said proposed district have been omitted; and

It further appearing that said petitioners have filed a good and sufficient undertaking conditioned that the petitioners will pay all expenses of the organization of the district, including publication of notices, the expenses of preparation and delivery of ballots, and the fees of election officers, and any and all expenses which may be incurred on the part of the County in the formation, election and organization of such sanitary district.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the name of the proposed district shall be the NORTH UMPQUA SANITARY DISTRICT.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the boundaries of said sanitary district located in Douglas County, Oregon, shall be as follows:

Beginning at the point of intersection of the present North Roseburg Sanitary District boundary with the East R/W Line of the Southern Pacific Railroad in Section 1, T. 27 S., R. 6 W., W.M.

Thence, West to the West R/W line of Hooker Road;

Thence, North along the West R/W line of Hooker Road to the South R/W line of General Avenue;

Thence, West along the South R/W line of General Avenue to the East R/W line of Bower Street;

Thence, South along the East R/W line of Bower Street to the point of intersection with the Easterly prolongation of the north line of the Don Housley property as described in Vol. 197, Deed Records of Douglas County, Oregon;

Thence, West along the last mentioned line to the East R/W line of U. S. Highway No. 9;

Thence, North along said East R/W line to the S. W. corner of Lot 31 of Edmonson Orchard Tracts;

Thence, West along the Easterly prolongation of the south line of Lot 32 of said Edmonson Orchard Tracts to the south line of said Lot 32;

Thence, West along the south line of said Lot 32 to a point in the west line of Sec. 12, T. 27 S., R. 6 W.;

Thence, North along the west line of said Sec. 12 to the west line of Sec. 1, said Township and Range to the N. W. corner of Lot 8, said Edmonson Orchard Tracts;

Thence, Easterly and North along the East and West lines of Lot 8, and the West and North lines of Lot 7, and the North line of Lot 4, all of said Edmonson Orchard Tracts to the East R/W line of U. S. Highway No. 9;

Thence, North along the East R/W line of said Highway to the south bank of the North Umpqua River;

Thence, Easterly along the left bank of said river, upstream, to the east corner of Rio Verde, as filed and recorded in the office of the County Clerk in Vol. 6 of Plats at Page 2;

Thence, South to the South R/W line of Page Road, County No. 115-A;

Thence, West along said South R/W line to the N. E. corner of the J. D. Amacher property as described in Vol. 107, Plat No. 232, Deed Records of Douglas County, Oregon;

Thence, South and West along the East and South lines of said Amacher property to the extension thereof to the Southeast corner of Woody Oaks, as filed and recorded in Vol. 9 of Plats, Page 39, Records of Douglas County, Oregon;

Thence, West along the south line of said Woody Oaks to an angle point;

Thence, South along an east line of said J. D. Amacher property 50.0 ft. to a point;

Thence, West along a line 50 ft. from and parallel to the South line of "Woody Oaks" to intersect with the East line of Sec. 25, T. 26 S., R. 6 W.;

Thence, South along the East line of said Sec. 25 to the East line of Section 34, said Township and Range and the East line of Sec. 1, T. 27 S., R. 6 W. to a point in the North line of the existing North Roseburg Sanitary District boundary;

Thence, West along said boundary to the Point of Beginning.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that an election be held within the proposed North Umpqua Sanitary District on Tuesday, November 19, 1963, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock A.M. and 8:00 o'clock P.M. for the purpose of determining whether or not said proposed district shall be organized as a sanitary district and for the purpose of electing five members to the sanitary board for said district. At said election all qualified electors resident within the proposed district for the period requisite to enable them to vote at a general election shall be entitled to vote at the election above provided for.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all of the area proposed to be incorporated within the sanitary district shall be considered as one precinct, and the polling place shall be at Winchester School, Winchester, Oregon, in said district; and Joan Kroegel and Helen Bartlett, and Winifred Travis, and Pearl C. Brown, all being qualified electors, residing within the proposed district, shall constitute the Board of Election. The ballots shall contain the words, besides the legal description of the proposed district, "Sanitary District: YES—", or "Sanitary District: NO—", or the equivalent thereof, and the voter shall place a cross at the space provided for immediately after "YES" or "NO" which ever shall indicate his choice.

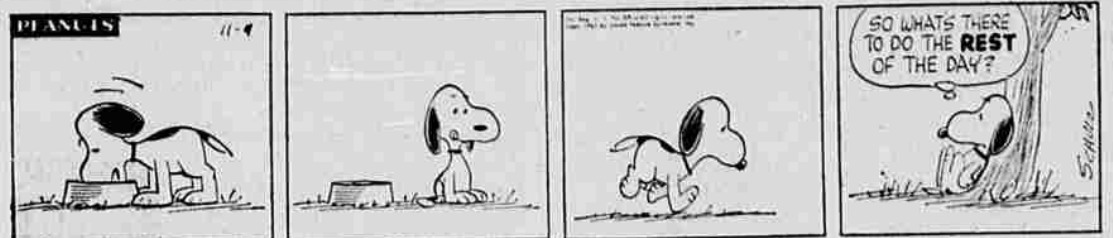
