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Council Fathers Will Talk Plan For Decentralization Of Authority In Catholic Church

VATICAN CITY (UPI)—Ecclesiastical Council fathers have granted autonomy to individual bishops and to national conferences of bishops such as the U.S. National Catholic Welfare Conference (NCWC).

The vote followed a sharp debate in which the plan came under fire from both liberals and conservatives. The liberals said it did not go far enough in recognizing the right of bishops to run their own dioceses without interference from the Roman Curia. The conservatives

applauded when he called for amendment of the document to establish an episcopal senate in Rome which would represent all of the bishops of the world. He said this new body would advise and assist the Pope in governing the church and would outrank the Roman Curia and give it orders.

Would Share Rule
This proposal for a permanent body in Rome to enable bishops to share with the pontiff government of the church was strongly supported by several other speakers, including Bishop Joseph Hodges of Wheel-

ing, W. Va., and Ukrainian Archbishop Maxim Hermaniuk of Winnipeg, Canada.

The conservative counter-attack was led by Ernesto Cardinal Ruffini of Palermo. He said the proposal to grant legislative powers to national conferences of bishops contains "many dangers" and would "open the way to undue freedom in the church."

Cardinal Ruffini charged that the council fathers have technically not yet approved theological doctrine that bishops share with the Pope in the govern-

ment of the church by divine right.

He minimized the importance of the test votes which the council took on this issue last week and said they should not be regarded as conclusive.

Sharpest Debate
At issue in the sharpest debate thus far in the council's 1963 session is a document entitled "Of Bishops and the Government of Dioceses."

It says that bishops should be given greater freedom to run their own dioceses without having to consult the Curia on many routine administrative

matters. It also would grant official recognition and real legislative powers to national conferences of bishops.

Under present church laws, these conferences can only make recommendations, which are not binding on any individual bishop who chooses to ignore them.

Conservative prelates view the document with alarm because they regard any decentralization of authority as a threat to the primacy of the pontiff.

Liberals are unhappy because

the language of the document seems to imply that the additional power to be exercised by bishops would be merely delegated by the Pope, rather than inherent in the office of the bishop.

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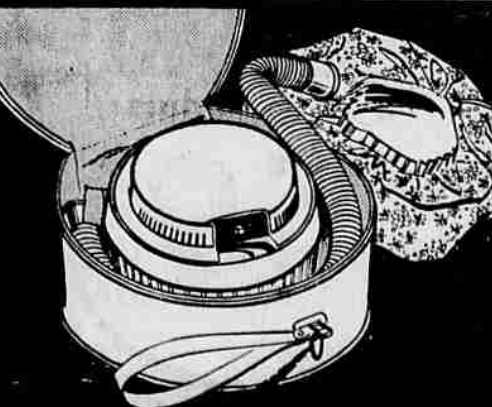
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
