



West's Bidding Encourages South

South bid and played very well, but I have to credit West with an assist in the bidding department. West's bids of two and three diamonds gave North two chances to show weakness by passing and South plenty of time to show distribution.

Finally, when North raised him to three hearts, South decided that North would surely hold at least four hearts and, while the queen was not guaranteed, South was willing to gamble on a slam.

Had West jumped right to three or four diamonds he would have crowded the bidding and South would probably have

wound up at game only.

There wasn't much to the play provided South was careful not to play three rounds of trumps. Actually, South did not play trumps at all at the start of his campaign.

He ruffed the diamond opening, led the ace of clubs and ruffed a second club low in dummy. He didn't try to guard against five clubs in the East hand because he did not see any good way to play against such an annoying development.

When both opponents followed to that second club, South was strolling down the boulevard. He led a trump to his ace, ruffed another club with the queen of trumps, drew trumps and conceded a spade trick.
