Elder Brown New Pastor For Roseburg Adventists

The Roseburg Seventh-day Adventist Church has a new pastor, and for the first time, an assistant pastor. Now serving the 540-member congregation as pastor is Elder Edwin G. Brown. He replaces Elder A. P. Ritz who accepted a call to the Medford church after serving in Roseburg for three years. James Surrency is the new assistant pastor. Elder Brown comes here from a seven-year tenure as pastor of the Spokane, Wash., Lincoln Seventh-day Adventist Church. He is married and has two children, a son, 12, who attends Roseburg Academy, and a 16-year-old daughter who is a student at Milo Academy near Canyonville. The new pastor was graduated from Walla Walla College in 1943. He spent seven years in the evangelism field in Montana and has held three-year pastorates at churches in Pasco and Moses Lake, Wash., plus a stay in Detroit, Mich., for additional training. He is a native of Tacoma, Wash., where he was a member of the high school swimming team, and lists swimming and outdoor sports as his major hobbies. Mrs. Brown, who also was graduated from Walla Walla College in 1943, is a registered nurse who received her training at Loma Linda University School of Nursing at Loma Linda, Calif. The family is residing in Roseburg at 267 SE Pitzer St. James Surrency is a native of New York City and is a 1962 graduate of Columbia Union College in Washington, D.C., completing part of the requirements for his degree with a one-year study at Newbold Missionary College near London, England. He has pursued his education with graduate studies at Andrews University in Berrien Springs, Mich. He has traveled extensively on the continent of Europe, studying Adventist institutions in France and Germany. During his college years, Surrency was chaplain of his class and also chaplain of the boys club, Delta Sigma Tau. He lists additional training, he is an avocation, beginning his writing while serving on a college newspaper. He is unmarried.

Today and Saturday of this week have officially been proclaimed Disabled American Veterans' Forget-Me-Not Days by Roseburg Mayor Thomas Garrison. The Dean Perrine Chapter No. 9 will be in charge of the sale, with headquarters in the old Broiler restaurant on SE Cass Avenue. Adam Coke, commander of the chapter, said all contributions received for the flowers will be used in the chapter's program of assistance for the handicapped of this community. "It's easy to show you remember and appreciate the sacrifices of the disabled men and women," he said. "The Forget-Me-Not you wear on Nov. 8 and 9 will show that you have not forgotten." In issuing his proclamation, Mayor Garrison urged the support of all citizens, interested groups and organizations for the two days. The DAV offers a free service to disabled veterans and their dependents in filing claims for government benefits and also assists in job, hospital, employment and other disabled veterans' problems and helps to meet emergency situations which may arise in the family of a disabled veteran.

Coast Meeting Draws Local Church Couple

The Rev. and Mrs. Edward J. Gallup will attend the annual Oregon-Pacific district Nazarene Preacher's Conference to be held at the Hotel Gearhart in Gearhart Nov. 12 through Nov. 14. Nearly all of the 76 Nazarene churches in the district will be represented. These churches have a total of 6,800 members, according to Gallup. Guest speaker at the conference will be Dr. V. H. Lewis of Kansas City, Mo., secretary of the denomination. He was board of general superintendents elected to the highest office in the church in 1960, following four years as secretary of evangelism. The Gallup family will leave Roseburg over the weekend to go first to Seattle to leave their son, Edward Jr., for a visit with relatives while the conference is in session.

'Rocky's' Campaign Shows Two Major Weaknesses

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller goes into his campaign for the Republican presidential nomination with two major weaknesses — his liberal image and his remarriage. These two handicaps were factors often mentioned in a UPI survey of Republican governors, state chairmen and national committee members. Partly leaders in more than 40 states were contacted after Rockefeller's formal announcement Thursday that he was a candidate. It was taken for granted that the New York governor and Sen. Barry Goldwater of Arizona, a still unannounced candidate, were headed into a long struggle leading up to the National Convention next July. Rockefeller was generally rated the underdog. A Rockefeller vs. Goldwater contest was commonly translated into a liberal vs. conservative race, although some GOP leaders contended that differences between the two men were overemphasized. Foreign policy, civil rights and welfare programs were cited as specific points of difference. There was little inclination to discount the political burden created by Rockefeller's marriage to a divorced mother of four children last May after his own divorce. Of the party leaders questioned, one or more in 26 states

felt that Rockefeller's chances were damaged to some degree by his remarriage. Some felt that this was a serious handicap which would never vanish; some felt that the unfavorable reaction had partly subsided and would fade even more. These appraisals were offered even by Republicans who deplored consideration of Rockefeller's personal life as a factor in the campaign. Party officials in only five states dismissed the remarriage as insignificant and eight others refused to guess about its political effects.
