



## FARM FOREST FACTS

Tree planters will be glad to hear that order blanks for seedlings from the state forest nurseries are now available. Orders should be sent to the Department of Forestry, Salem.

Trees are not for ornamental plantings, but are for the purpose of reforestation, wind protection, post production, game cover, Christmas trees and erosion control.

Order blanks may be had for the asking from five different sources in the county. They are: The County Extension Office, Roseburg; the DFFA headquarters, Roseburg; DFFA North Douglas office, Elkton; DFFA South Douglas office, Canyonville; the State Forest Nursery, Elkton.

This year, all but the west-side Douglas fir, the 1-0 Monterey pine and the 1-0 Sierra redwood will come from the Corvallis nursery. Next year, all trees will come from the Elkton nursery. Again, send your orders to Salem, unless you wish the above mentioned species.

In all, 18 conifers and five broadleaf species are available. In addition to those mentioned, they are: Eastside Douglas fir, ponderosa, Scotch, Lodgepole, Austrian, Knobcone and sugar pines; noble, grand, white and Shasta firs; Port Orford and incense cedar; Chinese arbutus; Norway spruce; Rocky Mountain juniper. Broadleaves are black locust, caragana, Chi-

nese elm, Russian olive and honey locust (thornless).

Minimum orders are for 50 trees for \$1. Thereafter, trees are sold in multiples of 50 trees at \$12.15 per thousand for conifers and 10-12 dollars for broadleaves, including shipping costs. Douglas-fir (westside), ponderosa and lodgepole pine, and noble fir in amounts of 10,000 or more are \$9-12 per thousand, purchaser paying shipping costs. Limits per customer are generally higher than previously.

For selection of species consult your county extension forester or state farm forester.

### Expansion Of Schools Studied In Reedsport

Future school expansion needs in Reedsport with the possibility of a junior high program as the next step in school development were considered Wednesday by the Reedsport Elementary District Board.

According to Dawn Pesneau, correspondent, the board named subject to confirmation, a representative 15-member public advisory group to study and make recommendations on overall needs of the future school population and possible locations of a future school plant. Members and administrators of the Reedsport High School district and the Gardiner Elementary District are included in those invited to take part. Industrial expansion in the Reedsport-Gardiner area is resulting in near capacity use of the existing school plants, Mrs. Pesneau said.
