RHS Announces Ticket Plans For Roseburg-Medford Clash

Tickets for the Roseburg-Medford state quarterfinal grid encounter Friday at Finlay Field will be on sale this week, with Roseburg High School acting as an agent for the Oregon School Activities Association.

Those fans holding reserved seat tickets for the current season will have the first opportunity to purchase the same seats for the playoff battle. These persons may purchase game tickets Tuesday and Wednesday evenings from 7 to 9 in the RHS gym lobby.

In the event that the holders of season tickets do not purchase the same seats by 9 p.m. Wednesday, the seats will be sold on a first come-first served basis Thursday at the school gym starting at 7 p.m. Telephone requests will not be honored.

General admission tickets may be purchased at J.C. Sporting Goods, The Toggery and The Man's Shop in downtown Roseburg beginning Wednesday. General admission tickets will also be on sale Thursday evening at the high school gym and Friday evening at the gate.

No general admission seats will be under cover for the game as they will be in the additional bleachers which will be set up for the playoff duel.

Trojans Blast Coastal Invaders, 20-12

Warming up for their initial encounter in the state A-2 playoffs, the Douglas Trojans romped to a decisive 20-12 triumph over the invading Bandon Tigers Saturday.

After battling to a scoreless deadlock through one quarter of play, the Trojans broke the ice with a six - pointer midway through the second period. Douglas added single tallies in each of the final two quarters to boost its record to 8-1 for the season.

Douglas swept to the Umpqua Valley League crown with a 5-0 record to earn a berth in the state A-2 quarterfinals. The first opponent for the Trojans in the playoffs will be the top ranked Phoenix Pirates, winners of the Rogue Valley League title. The game is scheduled for 8 p.m. Friday at Phoenix.

The Trojans drew first blood in the non-counter against Bandon in the second quarter as they marched 53 yards in eight plays. Gary Brown provided the scoring punch as he raced the final 12 yards.

In the closing seconds of the first half Bandon's Jerry Hultin blocked a Douglas punt on the 45-yard line, picked up the ball and returned it to the Douglas 19. Jim Summerlin snared a 19-yard pass from Billy Smith on the halfback option to give the Trojans the tie TD with one second showing on the clock.

Bandon opened the second half by driving to the Douglas 13, where the Trojans held. The winners then marched all the way back to score the go-ahead TD as Jim Heard dove into the end zone from one-yard out. Dan Withers ran the extra point to move the home team out in front, 13-6.

Douglas added an insurance tally in the final stanza as Floyd Meredith scored on a six-yard run to cap a 50-yard drive. Withers again ran for the PAT. The scoring drive was set up by Larry Rust's fumble recovery at the midfield stripe.

The Trojans came back with a 45-yard drive. David Howard scored on a four-yard carry.

Heard led the Trojans' wicket ground attack, carrying 19 times for 120 yards. This brings the rugged fullback's season's total to over 1,000 yards in nine games.

Douglas rushed for 216 yards and completed one of four pass attempts for 23 yards to give the winners a total net yardage of 223 yards. The Trojans were limited to 70 yards on the

ground and completed seven of 13 aerials for 111 yards. Each team had 12 first downs.

The invaders lost the ball twice on fumbles on the rain-soaked field. Punting the Trojans kicked three times for an average of 19.7 yards and the losers punted twice for an average of 25.5 yards. Douglas was charged with two penalties for 16 yards and Bandon had

three for 12 yards.
