Colorful Bowling Pro Sets Appearance Here Tuesday

One of bowling's most colorful competitors and instructors, Jerome (Whitey) Harris, will be at Indian Lanes Tuesday at 1 p.m.

Harris will be in Roseburg to give a bowling exhibition and to give special instruction to the bowlers from the Veterans Hospital. He is a representative of the Brunswick Corp.

Along with his reputation for mirth-making, Harris is recognized as one of the country's top bowlers. He's been at the game for more than 30 years and has a record of 31 perfect games, 20 consecutive ABC Tournaments and many championships.

His big years were as captain of the famed Budweiser team of St. Louis, which he organized in 1954. "They took a host of national honors before Whitey resigned after the 1957-58 season.

Nowadays Harris is what might be termed an "international bowler," rolling exhibitions in England, Mexico, Puerto Rico, Alaska, Japan, Korea and Hawaii.

He was drafted by Miami in the National Bowling League.

As a member of the Brunswick Advisory Staff of Champions, Harris is one of more than 130 big league stars who promote bowling with exhibition and instruction appearances throughout the country.

Drain's Warriors ran wild to capture undisputed control of second place in the Emerald League standings Saturday with a 56-14 shellacking of the host Pleasant Hill Hillbillies.

The Warriors ended the season with an 8-1 record, finishing second in conference play for the second consecutive year. Drain's hopes for the league championship were doused as the Junction City Tigers upended the Elmira Falcons, 23-7, to earn the District 5-A-2 playoff berth with a record of eight wins and one tie. The lone loss suffered by Drain was at the hands of the newly crowned league champs.

In other league games Saturday the McKenzie Eagles downed the Harrisburg Eagles, 19-12, and the St. Francis Saints of Eugene rolled over the Oakridge Warriors, 26-0.

Drain was held to a mere seven points in the first quarter, then broke loose with a 21-point second period. In the second half the Warriors continued to run wild, enjoying a 49-0 lead before the Hillbillies managed to break through with a TD.

The first tally for the Warriors came on a freak 39-yard pass play from quarterback Gordon Jensen to Gordon Gribble. Jensen threw the aerial to Roger Rutledge at the Pleasant Hill 25-yard marker, but Rutledge bobbled the ball. Gribble, downfield to provide interference, grabbed the ball before it touched the turf and raced the remaining distance for the TD. Mark Thomas ran for the PAT.

Once they had scored, the Warriors added tallies on drives of 49, 67, 55, 60, 64 and 45 yards the next six times they got control of the ball.

four-yard plunge and Thomas ran for the PAT. The next six-point drive came on a 59-yard pass-run combination with Thomas doing the throwing and Rutledge serving as the target. Jerry Smith powered his way into the end zone for the PAT. Just before the halftime intermission the Warriors struck again, with Thomas capping a 55-yard drive with a nine-yard romp and Smith running for the PAT.

The Warriors added 14 points in the third period, and opened the scoring in the final stanza to move out in front, 49-0. Johnson, Thomas and Backus provided the scoring power in the second half. Thomas led the charge with TD runs of 12 and three yards.

Trailing, 49-0, the Hillbillies marched 70 yards for their first TD, with Delbert Mann knitting over left guard for the final one yard. The passing combination of Mike Olsen and Steve Doudy provided the home team with the remainder of its points.

LS Gridders End Season Unbeaten

Lewis and Clark's Pioneers sat back and began a week-long wait today to see if they will receive a semifinalist bid for the NAIA Camellia football bowl. The first two semifinal berths are scheduled to be filled next Monday.

The Pioneers, ranked eighth in the NAIA poll last week, completed an unbeaten season and captured the Northwest Conference championship by defeating Pacific 35-7 at Portland Saturday.

They finished the regular campaign with an 8-0 record. Halfback Mickey Hergert ran for 180 yards in 26 carries to set a conference career total offense record with 3,870 yards.

The old mark was 3,811 set by Charlie Alvaro from 1956 through 1959.

Hergert scored touchdowns on runs of 1, 8 and 53 yards. Linfield edged Oregon Collegiate Conference champion Portland State 14-7 at McMinnville.
