Commendation Medal Given

Lt. Colonel James F. Hilgenberg was awarded the Air Force Commendation Medal at retirement ceremonies at the Air Reserve Records Center, Denver, Colo., Oct. 31. He was cited for "exceptional service in planning for and effecting a smooth transition to a computerized electronic data system for Reserve personnel."

Colonel Hilgenberg is a veteran of more than 22 years military service. He entered the Army in 1941, prior to Pearl Harbor, and was assigned to the Army Air Corps. In December 1942 he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant. During his military career he served at several bases in the United States, in Adak, Alaska, and with the Allied Air Forces in Central Europe.

Among his other awards are the American Defense Service Medal, American Campaign Medal, National Defense Service Medal, World War II Victory Medal, Air Force Longevity Service Award with four Bronze Oak Leaf Clusters, and

Armed Forces Reserve Medal with Hour Glass Device. Colonel Hilgenberg is married to the former Dorothy Jackson, whose parents are lifelong residents of Roseburg. Mrs. Hilgenberg's father is Douglas County Judge V. T. Jackson. Her brother is Elton Jackson of Winchester.

Colonel Hilgenberg and Dorothy have two children, James F. Jr., and Jeanne. All have visited in the Roseburg area many times. They spent several weeks here last summer.

For the present, Colonel Hilgenberg will continue to live at his current address — 1091 Tucson, Aurora, Colo.
