

## Duncan Ask Federal Jobs For Oregon

The Roseburg Chamber of Commerce has received a letter from U. S. Rep Robert B. Duncan informing it he is attempting to set up a series of conferences between local businessmen and representatives of the major federal agencies in a campaign to bring more federal contracts to the district.

"What I have envisioned is a series of half-day meetings for local business interests with speakers outlining the opportunities available and procedures necessary for securing government contracts in fields not now represented in our area," Duncan says.

He says his campaign will apply to businessmen in the entire 4th Congressional District. He said such meetings might be held at centrally-located cities, such as Eugene, Roseburg, Medford and Coos Bay.

Duncan said he would supply speakers, who would be representatives of various federal agencies if the Chambers would arrange the conferences.

Duncan said he is interested in seeing industries in the 4th District compete for the opportunity to supply various federal agencies with goods and services.

Roseburg Chamber of Commerce Manager Harold Reaume said he's certain the Chamber board of directors will cooperate in the project. The matter will be discussed at a board meeting tonight in Roseburg.

## Fir Grove Youngsters Get Bicycle Licenses

The Roseburg Police Department issued 105 bicycle licenses to boys and girls at Fir Grove School Saturday morning.

Chief of Police John T. Truett said he and his assistants were kept busy during the three-hour period.

Dates will be arranged for license issuing at the other schools within the city very shortly. Rose School is next in line. The city has secured 2,000 licenses to be issued by June 30 of next year. The license costs 50 cents and is good for the life of the bike.

The principal purpose of licensing is control and detection in case of theft. It is very difficult to trace an unlicensed bicycle that has been stolen, said Truett.

Currently the city has six bicycles recovered within the city waiting to be claimed by their owners. They are unlicensed and have no other way to be traced to their owners, except by the owners presenting their claim.

## Barghoorn Was Held For Sixteen Days In Tiny Prison Cell

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (UPI)—Yale political science Professor Frederick C. Barghoorn, 52, spent 16 days in a small lighted cell in Lubyanka Prison at Moscow, it was learned today.

Mrs. Elizabeth Barghoorn, 60, mother of the mild-mannered professor, said, "the food was very poor, and he lost 10 pounds." The professor's mother, who lives in an apartment adjacent to her sons' said two Russian policemen arrested him "and he was handcuffed." She said they took her son to a "little cell" where a light burned 24 hours a day.

Funeral services for Alvin Russell Obrist, a longtime Roseburg resident, will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday in Wilson's Chapel of the Roses with the Rev. James Smith of the First Christian Church officiating.

Obrist, 70, died Saturday night at a local hospital.

Private interment at Roseburg Memorial Gardens will follow the services.

Obrist for many years worked as a car man for Southern Pacific Railroad and was a member of the Brotherhood of Railway Car Men of America, Eugene Lodge 149. He was a World War I veteran.

Obrist was married to Ethel McCoy at Klamath Falls in 1923. Surviving are his wife, Ethel, of Roseburg; two daughters, Jacqueline Wisniewski of Portland and Genova Book of Roseburg; five grandchildren; three brothers, Lloyd and John Obrist of Albany and Carey Obrist of Wheeler, Ore.; two sisters, Anna Propst of Albany and Elizabeth Stoaks of Palo Alto, Calif.

## George Gets National American Legion Job

Jack George, commander of the Umpqua American Legion Post of Roseburg, is one of the men named to a list of national committee jobs now the crux of controversy at the leadership level of the state Legion.

He was named to the Resolutions Assignment Committee of the national Legion organization by Karl Wagner, national executive committee member of Portland. Now a resolution asking Wagner to resign has been adopted by the Department of Oregon Executive Committee.

The state Legion's official house magazine, the Legionnaire, says the controversy is over the manner in which recommendations were made to national Legion headquarters for selection of Oregon Legion members for national appointments.

Lists Presented It says that shortly before the state Executive Committee made its resolution, Department Commander William R. Stevens and Wagner had each presented to the national Legion's Committee on Committees at Indianapolis, Ind., lists of recommendations for appointments to national committees.

Cmdr. Stevens said Wagner had disregarded the recommendations he (Stevens) had made. The Legionnaire reports that as a result the major appointments made by the national commander are generally those from Wagner's list wherever there was conflict between the names proposed by Stevens and those proposed by Wagner.

Stevens emphasizes he has no quarrel with individuals selected, but he does question the methods used in making the selections. Wagner retorts that the method of department commander and department executive committee submitting separate lists has been in effect many years and is followed by all states.

Wagner Refuses Wagner has refused to resign and has asked for a bill of particulars.

## Wallace Claims Anybody Is Better Than Kennedy

DALLAS (UPI)—Gov. George Wallace of Alabama, puffing on a cigar and greeting everybody in sight, arrived in Dallas Sunday night and said he might run for the Democratic nomination for President in the Indiana and New Hampshire primaries.

"I'm not thinking of running to help Barry Goldwater," Wallace said, "but I'm not going to help the Kennedys either."

"Anybody would be better than Kennedy," Wallace said.

Wallace said he was thinking about running in the northern primaries because of "the excellent reception" he had on his recent speaking trip.

"They weren't just appreciative—they were enthusiastic," Wallace said.

Wallace is scheduled to hold a press conference today and make a speech at a public affairs club luncheon.

"I think the Kennedys are the worst thing that has happened to the nation," he said, "and if I run, I intend to show the people the truth."

"We don't want anybody coming in from the outside to tell us how to run our affairs."
