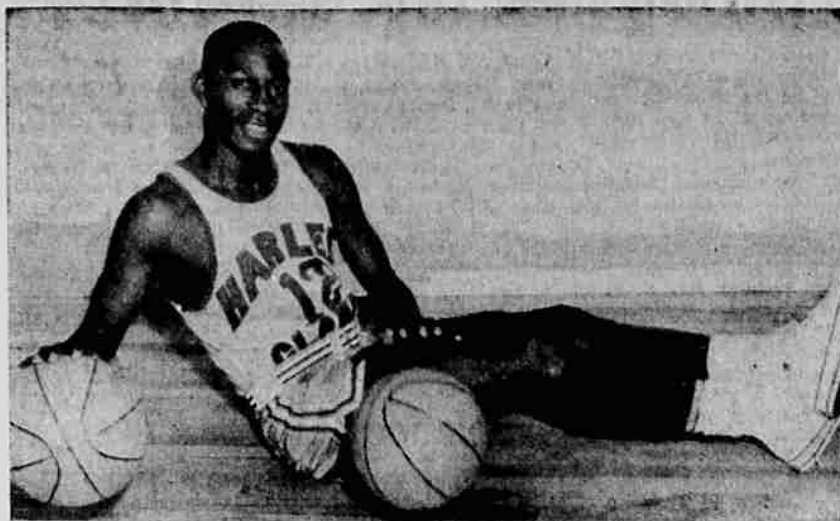

Bears Destroy Packers; NY Giants Dump '49ers

48-14, while the St. Louis Cardinals upset the Cleveland Browns, 20-14. The Giants, with an 8-2 record, now hold a one-game lead over deadlocked Cleveland and St. Louis.

In Sunday's other games, the Pittsburgh Steelers remained in the running with a 34-28 win over the Washington Redskins; the Los Angeles Rams upset the Detroit Lions, 28-21; the Baltimore Colts edged the Minnesota Vikings, 37-34, and the Dallas Cowboys beat the Philadelphia Eagles, 27-20.

The Bears won the NFL's biggest battle of 1963 by beating the Packers at their own game — a crushing ground attack and an unyielding defense. Those were the weapons the Packers had used to win three straight Western titles and the last two NFL playoff games.

Sunday the Bears were supreme right from the opening minutes and by a more convincing margin than their 10-3 win over the Packers on the opening Sunday of the season. A sellout crowd of 49,166 watched the game at Chicago.

Quarterback Billy Wade completed only 6 of 14 passes, but the Chicago ground forces of Willie Galimore, Joe Marconi and Rick Casares ground out 248 rushing yards. Galimore's 79 yards were eight more than the

Papa's Bears, using his "old-fashioned" techniques of ball control and defense, destroyed the proud Green Bay Packers, 26-7, Sunday and virtually assured the NFL of a new champion. Four weeks still remain in the season but the Bears are in command with a 9-1 record and a one-game lead over the Packers in the Western Division.

The New York Giants also assumed the undisputed lead in the Eastern Division of the league when they clobbered the San Francisco Forty Niners,

Texas Gunning For First Undeclared Season In 43 Yrs.

Put Texas in the Cotton Bowl, start Navy on its way, then duck for cover when the big gridiron heroes start scrambling to fill in the missing pieces next week.

Texas, the No. 1 college football team in the nation and the only major school to boast a perfect record, deservedly earned the first of the juicy bowl assignments by beating Texas Christian, 17-0, on Saturday. The Longhorns, with a 9-0 mark, can complete their first perfect season in 43 years by defeating a weak Texas A&M squad on Thanksgiving Day.

Baylor still has a chance to catch Texas and force a tie in the Southwest Conference should the Longhorns falter in their final game, but the Cotton Bowl still belongs to Texas since it

owns a decision over Baylor.

Second-ranked Navy continued to shine as the most impressive opponent for Texas by outlasting Duke, 38-25, as Roger Staubach set two Academy records. The Midshipmen will carry an 8-1 record into their season finale against Army, Nov. 30.

Tom Stockton, a third-string fullback, scored once and paced the Texas attack against TCU. Staubach, a familiar name in the Navy backfield, broke school season records for most pass completions and most yardage gained. John Sai added a 93-yard run, the longest scoring dash in Navy history.

The situation concerning the other major bowl games is a lot more muddled but the puzzle will solve itself in a lot of cases next Saturday.

A quick survey of the bowl picture reveals:

Rose Bowl: Michigan State, ranked No. 4, needs at least a tie against eighth-rated Illinois to clinch the Big Ten title and a spot in the granddaddy of all post-season games. Should the Illini win the contest at East Lansing, they'll earn the trip to Pasadena.

Washington, upset 14-0 by UCLA on Saturday, still can clinch the host berth and the Big Six title by beating Washington State at Seattle. Another Huskie loss, however, can send the bid to UCLA or Southern California, who clash at Los Angeles.

Orange Bowl: Ninth-ranked Nebraska, a 20-16 victor over Oklahoma State, tangles with Oklahoma at Lincoln in a game which will decide the Big Eight titlist and an Orange Bowl

berth. The sixth-ranked Sooners stayed in contention by beating Missouri, 13-3, Saturday.

Best bet for the other spot at Miami, Fla., on New Year's Day is fifth-ranked Pittsburgh, swamped Army, 28-0, to boost its season record to 7-1. The Panthers still have two games remaining against Penn State next Saturday and Miami Nov. 30.

Sugar Bowl: Third-ranked Mississippi remained atop the Southeastern Conference standings by topping Tennessee, 20-0 and can gain the host berth at New Orleans by stopping tough Mississippi State, Nov. 30. Pittsburgh is a contender for the other spot, although this is not likely.

In other conference races, Princeton can clinch the Ivy

League crown by beating Dartmouth; Ohio University can do the same in the Mid-American Conference with a triumph against Marshall; Western Kentucky, unbeaten in the Ohio Valley, closes against Murray State; North Carolina, North State and Duke all are deadlocked for the Atlantic Coast lead with North Carolina meeting Duke next week; Virginia Tech meets VMI for the Southern Conference crown Thanksgiving Day; Cincinnati leads in the Missouri Valley but Wichita and Tulsa both are in the running; and Arizona and Arizona State are tied in the Western Athletic Conference although Arizona St. is not eligible for the title.
