

Senate Probers Divided In TFX Contract Ruckus

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Senate investigators were divided Thursday over whether Deputy Defense Secretary Roswell Gilpatric should have disqualified himself in the TFX contract award.

The division among members of the Senate permanent investigations subcommittee became apparent at the end of three days of questioning of Gilpatric about possible executive favoritism in the warplane case.

PLANE PASSES TEST

FT. BENNING, Ga. (UPI)—A new airplane designed to take off straight up passed its test flight "beautifully" at this infantry center Wednesday.

Called the Hummingbird, the twin-jet, fixed-wing craft left the ground vertically, hovered for a moment and then zoomed forward in normal flight.

The plane, built for the Army by Lockheed Aircraft Co., is designed to take off or land without benefit of a runway as required by conventional aircraft.

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Pope Paul Intervenes To Expedite Work Of Ecumenical Council Meet

VATICAN CITY (UPI)—Pope Paul VI intervened Thursday to expedite the work of the Ecumenical Council by adding new members to the key commissions which process documents for council action.

The Pope's move was announced at the session by Archbishop Pericle Felici, secretary general of the council. He said the Pope acted in response to "requests from many council fathers" and to make the council commissions "work more efficiently."

Felici said that by papal order all council commissions will be expanded to 30 members. At present most of them have 25. Of the five new members of each commission, one will be chosen by the Pope personally and the other four will be elected by the council fathers.

National conferences of bishops were invited to submit nominations for the new commission posts, with balloting scheduled for next Thursday.

Liberals Gain Strength

High council sources said the net effect of the reshuffle will be to give the liberal wing much stronger representation in the commissions.

The liberals now command more than a two-thirds majority in the council on floor votes.

Policemen Will Take Administrative Class

The Roseburg Police Department will start a 16-week police administrative course starting Dec. 5, according to Chief John T. Truett.

The course is sponsored by the International Municipal City Managers Association for group training.

Truett, who will be division leader, said the course is mandatory for the sergeants, but nine patrolmen also have signed up, making 16 for the course. There are 16 chapters to be covered, and each person in the class will make a special study and report on his phase of the study.

Truett said he completed the course in 1951 and Capt. Bert Eaton in 1955.

but they have hitherto felt that church has ever gone in allowing the replacement of Latin in important church rites.

More than two-thirds of the council fathers voted in favor of the newly proposed amendment which will allow bishops on the regional level to give permission for even the central formula of the sacraments to be said in the language of the people.

Earlier, the council approved use of everyday language in large portions of the Mass.

But the liturgy document required that the essential part of a sacrament, the precise verbal formula with which it is administered, be left in Latin.

Earlier, the council voted to allow the full substitution of modern languages for Latin in Catholic baptisms, weddings and other sacraments.

Approve Three Chapters
The council also approved the first three chapters of a document outlining a path for further discussion. The council did not consider an additional chapter which condemns anti-Semitism and advocates unequivocal religious freedom.

The approval of full use of modern vernacular languages instead of Latin in the sacraments was a significant extension of a liturgical reform already approved in principle. Today's vote was the farthest the

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
