The Cardinals broke a 17-17 tie against the Giants on Charley Johnson's three-yard touchdown pass to Bobby Joe Conrad early in the final period. Garland Boyette set up the score by recovering a fumbled punt by the Giants' Ed Dove on the New York 20.

At Pittsburgh, the Bears twice went ahead on short touchdown runs, by Willie Galimore and Ron Bull, only to have the Steelers come back to score on Dick Hoak's six-yard run and Ed Brown's 31-yard pass to rookie Roy Curry, tying the game at halftime, 14-14.

Lou Michaels put the Steelers ahead with an 11-yard field goal in the final quarter, four minutes before LeClerc tied the score permanently.

Jimmy Brown gained only 51 yards in 17 carries against Dallas, leaving him 30 yards short of his own NFL season rushing record of 1,527. But Frank Ryan threw touchdown passes of 11 and 16 yards to Gary Collins and Ross Fichtner ran back an interception 36 yards for another Cleveland TD. The Browns intercepted four passes by Don Meredith during the second half.

First Half Surge
The Packers, with Bart Starr back at quarterback, scored all 28 points during the first half against the Forty Niners. Elijah Pitts, filling in for injured Tom Moore, threw a 21-yard touchdown pass to Ron Kramer and also ran 14 yards for another score.

Danny Villanueva's 13-yard field goal in the third period produced the Rams' upset win over the Colts. Art Perkins scored two Los Angeles touchdowns of one-yard bucks and Jim Martin kicked Baltimore field goals of 39, 22 and 41 yards.

Fran Tarkenton's passes to Paul Flatley set up a two-yard touchdown plunge by Tommy Mason with less than two minutes to play and gave Minnesota its win over Detroit.

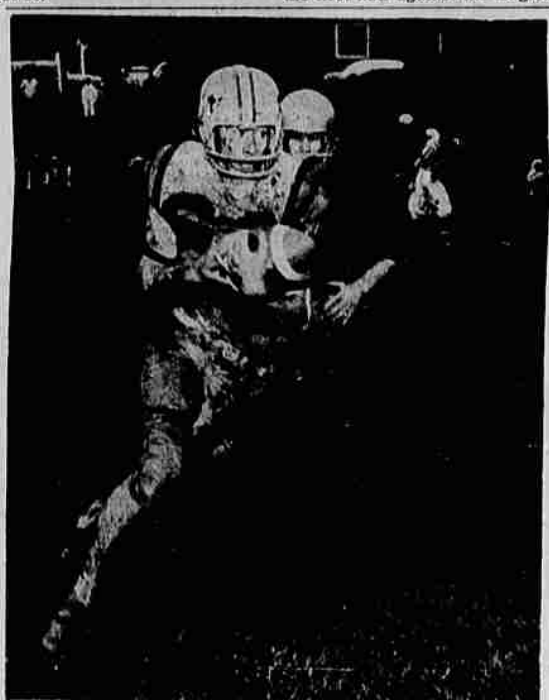
Bob Khayat's field goals of 37 and 22 yards, followed by Dick James' spectacular catch of a 31-yard touchdown pass from Norm Snead, produced all of Washington's points during the first half against the Eagles.

The Cardinals upset the New York Giants, 24-17, Sunday and made it a new race in the Eastern Division. The Cleveland Browns, by defeating the Dallas Cowboys, 27-17, joined in the first-place tie with St. Louis and New York. All have 8-3 records.

The Pittsburgh Steelers nearly threw the Western Division into a deadlock, too, but LeClerc kicked an 18-yard field goal with 4:31 remaining to give the Bears a 17-17 tie.

The Green Bay Packers, who defeated the San Francisco Forty Niners, 28-10, would have tied for the lead if the Bears had lost. Chicago now has a 9-1-1 record; Green Bay is 9-2.

In Sunday's other games, played on a Sunday of mourning for President Kennedy, the Los Angeles Rams edged the Baltimore Colts, 17-16; the Minnesota Vikings squeezed past the Detroit Lions, 34-31; and the Washington Redskins defeated the Philadelphia Eagles, 13-10.

Vancouver Lions Capture Spot In Canadian Finals

Rolling to a 36-1 triumph, the Vancouver, B.C., Lions earned the right to represent the Western Division of the Canadian Pro Football League in the Nov. 30 Grey Cup football finals.

Saturday's decisive triumph over the Saskatchewan Roughriders gave the Lions a 2-1 edge in their three-game playoff series against the Roughriders. The Nov. 30 game will be telecast nationally in the U.S.

According to the UPI reports the only point for the Roughriders came in the first quarter when Martin Fabi kicked a single into the Vancouver end zone.

Vancouver enjoyed a 16-1 halftime edge as the result of three field goals by Peter Kempf and a TD pass from Joe Kapp to Willie Fleming for 73 yards. In the second half the Lions scored three times, with ex-Roseburg and Oregon State star fullback Nub Beamer plunging three-yards for the first six-pointer.

Beamer, a hard-charging fullback, has been one of the main cogs in the Lions' success this year. When the Lions compete in the Grey Cup game it will be their first appearance in the game which decides the Canadian championship.

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Jefferson Halts Eagles In State Playoffs, 25-6

A nemesis by the name of Dick Brown overshadowed the efforts of the Yoncalla Eagles in Saturday's B 11-man state semifinal game against the Jefferson Lions.

Brown scored four TDs and racked up most of Jefferson's total yardage as he went on the rampage to lead the District 1 champs to a 25-6 triumph and eliminate the Eagles, winners of the District 2 crown, from the state playoffs.

The host Eagles installed the home fans with hope when Bob Vian broke loose and raced down the left sideline 50 yards after grabbing a punt out of the air. Vian's first quarter tally tied the game at 6-all in the first quarter, but the invading Lions racked up 12 points in the second quarter to enjoy an 18-6 halftime edge.

Brown's spectacular one-man show earned him praise from both coaches. The fleet half-back carried 22 times for a grand total of 281 yards. In addition he had help in the ground gaining department by Robert Kihls and Larry Ellis, both of whom gave the Eagle defenders trouble throughout the game.

While Brown was stealing the show, the Eagles came through with a top performance from David Knowles on the ground and the passing of Richard Wales.

The Eagles, noted for their defense work in winning the Bico-Trico B League championship, turned in a creditable performance in limiting the high-powered Lions to 25 points. The Eagles held the Lions several times inside their own 25-yard marker, while on offense the losers threatened several times in the second half but each time were unable to get the necessary yardage once they got across the Jefferson 30.

After being held, the Eagles

unted in the opening minutes of the first quarter, with the skinskin ending on the Jefferson 30.

On the next play Brown faked to his left, cut outside right tackle where he got a key block from Lloyd Wickett. Once he was in the clear the Lion star raced 70-yards for the opening score.

The Eagles came back midway through the first quarter with their lone tally. On a trade of punts the Eagles came out on top as Vian took the Jefferson kick at the midfield stripe and tight-rope his way down the left sideline for the tying TD.

From this point on the scoring was all don by the Lions. Brown racked up second quarter TDs on runs of 21 and 80 yards, then scored in the final stanza on a 15-yard ramble.

Just before the halftime intermission the Eagles marched to the Jefferson 34 before punting.

The punt went into the end zone for a touchback, giving the invaders control on their own 20. Brown swept around his own right end, evaded would be tacklers and outraced the defenders 80 yards for the six-pointer with 45 seconds remaining in the first half.

In the closing seconds the Eagles took to the air and were back on the Jefferson 20 as the halftime gun sounded.

Yoncalla's stubborn defense stopped several threats in the second half, alertly picking off Jefferson passes and recovering vital fumbles.

The deepest penetration for the Eagles in the second half was to the Jefferson 13 late in the third period, but the Lions' defensive unit dug in and forced the Eagles back to the 20 where the local crew gave up the ball on downs.

Besides suffering the loss in the semifinal battle, the Eagles had more hard luck in the closing minutes of play as defensive standout Roger Johnson suffered a back injury when he covered a Jefferson fumble after the whistle had blown. The extent of Johnson's injuries were not immediately known, but the outstanding lineman was carried off the field on a stretcher and taken to a hospital for further examination.

The defeat knocked the Eagles out of the running for the state championship, with Jefferson and Wasco set to knock heads this weekend for the crown.
