

UNF Radiological Stations Planned

Radiological monitoring stations will be established soon at the Umpqua National Forest supervisor's office and at all ranger stations of the forest, reports Supervisor Vondis E. Miller.

He said certain radiological monitoring responsibilities have been assigned to the secretary of agriculture, so weekly readings of the monitoring equipment will be made. From these readings, radioactivity can be effectively measured in the event of drift and fallout from an atomic explosion.

Meanwhile, 15 Umpqua National Forest personnel completed a two-day radiological monitoring school in Roseburg last week. Conducted by John Meier and Doug Finch, fire control officers for the Umpqua and Rogue River national forests, respectively, the sessions dealt with the meaning and use of various monitoring instruments.
