

Twenty-Four Room Mansion Will Be New Home Of Bing Crosbys

HILLSBOROUGH, Calif. (UPI)—A 24-room Tudor-style mansion, shaded by fine old oak trees and overgrown with ivy, is to be the next home of the Bing Crosby family.

Leaving Southern California and their West Los Angeles mansion behind, the singer is

expected to move his wife, Kathy, and their three young children to this exclusive San Francisco suburb sometime after the first of the year.

The cost of the house is \$175,000. The reason for the move, Crosby says, is that they have a lot of friends around here. Another reason, according to some, is that the Crosbys want to raise their children well away from the Hollywood hustle and bustle.

All's Quiet

If it's quiet and seclusion that they want, they should find it in Hillsborough. The community

is one of the wealthiest suburbs of San Francisco. It rests in patrician isolation among the steep wooded hills of the San Francisco Peninsula skyline 18 miles south of the city.

It has three stories and an ivy-covered white brick exterior with a sloping slate roof and old-fashioned leaded windows. The garage, which can house six cars, has a patio of its own, a sitting room and two bedrooms.

There is a large foyer inside the entrance to the house, with

Spanish-style wrought iron light fixtures. To the right of the foyer is an oak-paneled library and an enormous drawing room with beamed ceilings and fireplace.

Mild Weather Forecast

October Mill Output Is Below September

PORTLAND (UPI)—October output at sawmills in the Pacific Northwest's Douglas fir region dropped from September, it was reported today.

October output at the mills was 162,001,000 board feet weekly, compared with a September figure of 171,618,000 board feet, according to the West Coast

Lumbermen's Association. But the first 10 months of the year were ahead of 1962 figures, WCLA said, despite the summer lumber strike. Sawmill production through October totaled about 6.81 billion board feet to 6.75 billion board feet for the previous year.

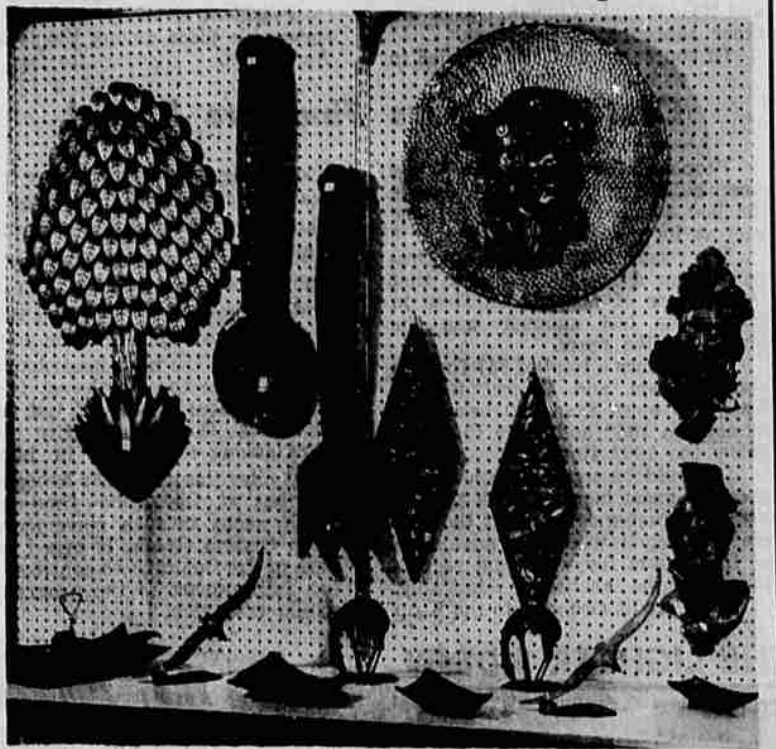
