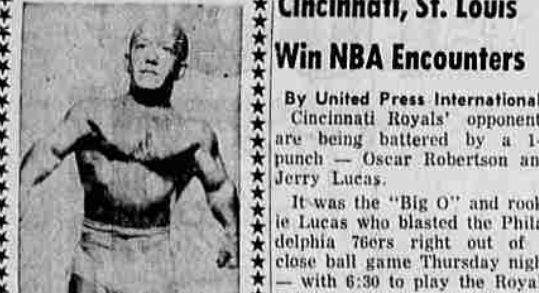

Chicago's Gary Peters Named '63 AL 'Rookie Of The Year'

BOSTON (UPI) — Southpaw Gary Peters, who had missed ring in four earlier trials with the White Sox, today was named the American League Rookie of the Year for 1963. The 26-year-old Chicago pitcher who had never pitched enough to attain major league status during his first four bids, racked up a 19-8 record last season to beat out teammate Pete Ward for the rookie honor.

Results of balloting by members of the Baseball Writers Association of America (BWAA) announced here by National Secretary Hy Hurwitz showed Peters the winner on 0 of the 20 ballots. Third baseman Ward collected six of the remaining votes while Minnesota slugger Jimmie Hall got the other four.

Big Six Rose Bowl Race Goes Down To Final Wire

By United Press International They came roaring down the home stretch in the race for the roses Saturday with three teams in the Big Six still in the battle for a bid to the post-season classic at Pasadena.

It's Washington vs. Washington State in the north; Southern California vs. UCLA in the south; and Stanford vs. California in the center.

About a quarter of a million fans are expected to see the three clashes—two of which will have a direct bearing on the Rose Bowl.

The three teams still with a chance to make the trip to Pasadena are Washington, USC and UCLA. The Huskies have a 3-1 conference record, while UCLA and Washington State are 2-1.

Washington plays five conference games compared with four for the two Los Angeles clubs.

Could Be Scramble So it could wind up in a scramble — especially if there should happen to be a tie in the north country.

If UCLA should win and Washington lose, the Bruins could go to the Rose Bowl with the worst record in history.

Right now they have an over-all mark of 2-7 and could be 3-7. But Washington and Southern California aren't exactly perfection, either. The Huskies, if they win the bid, would go against the Big Ten team carrying a 5-4 record. USC could come in with a 7-3 mark.

If Washington wins, it will get the bid, no matter what happens in Los Angeles.

A telegraphic vote of the faculty representatives of the schools will be taken immediately after the games. If the vote should end in a tie, then selection of the Rose Bowl team would be delayed.

Ford Again A sellout crowd of 55,000 will watch Washington send fullback, Another crowd of 80,000 is anticipated.

CV Hornets Face Eagle Valley In Battle For B 8-Man Crown

All the chips will be down Saturday when the Camas Valley Hornets host the Eagle Valley Eagles in the state B eight-man championship gridiron tilt at Myrtle Creek's Knox Field.

Kickoff time for the state championship game is set for 1:30 p.m.

The rampaging Hornets, seeking their first state championship in any sport and the first eight-man crown for a Douglas County team, will enter the game with a 9-1 record. Eagle Valley is undefeated in eight starts.

Camas Valley packs a powerful offensive thrust, having scored 505 points while allowing the opposition a mere 40 points—and 33 of these were scored by the Canyonville Tigers.

The Hornets marched to the league crown with a 67-0 win over Days Creek, a 54-7 triumph over Prospect, a 51-0 victory over Butte Falls and a 45-13

shellacking of Canyonville. In non-league outings the Hornets upended Days Creek, 68-0; Sisters, 41-0; and Butte Falls, 61-0.

In the playoffs the Hornets won the District 1 title with a convincing 52-0 walloping of Edenville, then stomped Dufur in the state semifinals, 47-0.

Eagle Valley earned the right to meet the Hornets for the title with a 33-27 win over Mt. Vernon. The Eagles' scored victories over North Powder, 33-26; Cove, 35-14; Imbler, 65-0; Huntington, 66-6; Halfway, 6-0; St. Francis, 6-0 and Hereford, 25-0.

During the regular season, Hereford was the defending state champion, defeating Canyonville in last year's playoff battle.

The Eagle Valley crew has racked up 289 points in eight games, and have had a total of 73 points scored against it.

Camas Valley goes into the game with an excess of speed and power in the backfield. The Hornets are led by Terry Volkman and Mike Priest. Volkman has gained over 1,400 yards rushing and leads the team in scoring with 168 points. Priest has racked up a total of 135 points. The two speedsters will start at the halfback positions.

At the quarterback spot for the Hornets will be Jim Kiser, who is capable of moving the ball through the air. The probable starters in the line include ends Terry Buel and Don Lawson, guards Jay Randall and Roger Thrush and center John Parret.

Defensively the Hornets will have Thrush and Kiser as ends, Randall and Bruce Smith as guards, Volkman, Priest and Gary Dean as linebackers and Lawson as defensive halfback.

The invaders from Eastern Oregon will have a slight weight advantage, and are reported to almost match the Hornets' speed. Coach Dick Stiles is bringing his team to the finale for the first time, losing out to Hereford in the Baker County

Denver and Oakland both will be idle Sunday. In other games, Buffalo plays at Boston and New York is at Kansas City. If Houston loses to San Diego, the winner of the Boston-Buffalo game will tie the Oilers for first place in the Eastern Division.

Denver managed a 3-2 half-time lead over the Raiders Thursday on a 52-yard field goal by Gene Mingo. But Oakland came alive with two touchdowns in the third quarter and scored 10 more points in the final period to take the win.

The Raiders capitalized on a pass interception by Tom Morrow to score their first TD. Quarterback Cotton Davidson threw a 35-yard pass to Bo Roberson on the four and Roberson went over to put Oakland ahead 8-3 early in the third quarter.

Oakland's other touchdowns came on a Denver fumble picked up by Oakland's Jon Jelacic, who ran across from the 19, and on a plunge by Glenn Shaw which followed a long run by Alan Miller.

Raiders Still In AFL Race

By United Press International The Oakland Raiders still had visions of an American Football League championship in their heads today following a 26-10 Thanksgiving Day win over Denver's victory-starved Broncos.

The Raiders, with a 7-4 record good for second place in the AFL's Western Division behind San Diego, will be pulling for Houston Sunday when the Eastern Division leaders play the Chargers at San Diego. If the Chargers lose Sunday and then fail to the Raiders the following week, the two teams will be tied for the Western Division lead.

Oakland strengthened its already strong hold on second place in the division with Thursday's win over Denver as the Raiders' star running back, Clem Daniles, tore up the Broncos' defense for 90 yards in 16 carries. The loss pushed Denver deeper into the league cellar.

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
