

Britain Pays Last Respects To Kennedy

LONDON (UPI)—Britain has said its last formal farewell to John F. Kennedy.

The queen and commoners, princes, premiers and prelates joined Sunday in two moving church services honoring the memory of the slain American President.

Queen Elizabeth II, making her first appearance at a formal function since the expected birth of her fourth child was announced, took part with 350 American servicemen in a memorial service in St. George's Chapel at Windsor Castle.

In London, more than 10,000 persons gathered at the massive St. Paul's Cathedral to mourn Kennedy and the "moment of madness" that killed him. Only 4,000 could get into the church and the crypt beneath. The rest stood outside in the December cold, listening patiently to the hour-long service through public address systems.

In both services, Britons and Americans sang together "The Star-Spangled Banner" and "The Battle Hymn of the Republic." Trumpeters standing in the American chapel of St. Paul's played the British "Last Post" and then the American "Taps," the last notes trailing away into the recesses of the cathedral's huge dome.

Prince Philip led the mourners to St. Paul's. Others there included Prie Minister Sir Alec Douglas-Home, former Prime Minister Harold Macmillan and Earl (Clement) Attlee, Soviet Ambassador Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn, U.S. Ambassador David Bruce, Princess Margaret, ambassadors from many nations and Princess Lee Radziwill, Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy's sister.

English Mayor Sends Sympathy On JFK's Death

The popularity of the late President John F. Kennedy throughout the world was felt last weekend by residents of Winchester, as they received a letter of sympathy at the loss of the President from the mayor and people of Winchester, England.

Winchester (England) Mayor Dorothy Richards wrote to the mayor of Winchester (Ore.):

"From Winchester, England, home and capital of King Alfred and a line of royal leaders of Wessex and England, I send on behalf of the citizens our deepest sympathy in the loss of your great president — a man who has worked so hard for peace and who has died so tragically.

"America, and the world, has suffered a grievous blow, and I wish to send this message of heartfelt condolence to all our sister cities of Winchester throughout the United States."

As Winchester (Ore.) has no mayor, the letter was accepted by Joseph Weckerle, president of the Winchester Civic Club. He told The News-Review he plans to write to Mayor Richards, offering the thanks of the people of this Douglas County community. He said he plans to try to convey the feelings of local residents about the death of President Kennedy by sending a copy of a story on the local reaction to the assassination which appeared in The News-Review the day following the President's death.

House Is Expected To Approve Bill To Protect JFK's Family

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The House was expected to move swiftly today to approve a bill that would provide temporary Secret Service protection and other benefits to President Kennedy's widow and children.

The bill was introduced only last Friday by Rep. Tom Murray, D-Tenn., chairman of the Service Committee.

Under an existing law, enacted in 1958, Mrs. Kennedy is entitled to a \$10,000 annual pension for the rest of her life.

Murray's bill would authorize:

—Lifetime franking privileges for Mrs. Kennedy, enabling her to send mail postage free.

—The General Services Administration to provide her with
