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Reindeer Don't Adjust Easily

Domesticating reindeer is no small chore. Ask the man who is doing it.
John Zumstein has a ranch near Redmond on which he raises reindeer. They originally were flown by air from Golovin, Alaska, within the Arctic Circle to his ranch. They were viewed during the weekend at Drive-N-Save Market. He said it takes two years to climatize a reindeer and from one to two years to harness-break them.

Weight of a female reindeer reaches about 250 pounds. Males get up to 500 pounds. Reindeer are of the caribou family. Bulls are very dangerous during the rutting (running) season, and must be kept in stockade during that time of year, if domesticated. Reindeer make wonderful sled pullers once they are harness-broken.

All reindeer (male or female) have antlers which they shed once a year and grow new ones. They also shed all their hair once a year.

In December, Zumstein and his reindeer, often with the assistance of Santa Claus, come to make millions of children happy for Christmas. Zumstein's reindeer with Santa have appeared with sleigh and a bag of toys in Christmas parades all over the West Coast in hundreds of towns. He has appeared in the seven western and northwestern states.
