PENDLETON (UPI)—Three Hawaiian residents testified Wednesday they believed scenic areas shown in advertising material they received were in or very near the Lake Valley subdivision where they bought land.

Seven Chicago and Los Angeles area men are on trial on mail fraud and conspiracy charges here in connection with sale of the land in Oregon's arid Harney County.

Port Of Umpqua Accepts Report On Landing Strip

An engineering report calling for a 3,000-foot landing strip for light airplanes on the Umpqua South Beach, as a part of the diversified recreational development of the area, was accepted by the Port of Umpqua Commission at its meeting this week.

The report, resulting from an intensive and comprehensive location, layout and cost estimate survey by Cornell, Howell, Hayes and Merryfield, Corvallis engineering firm, was submitted by engineer John T. Meier, reports correspondent Dawn Peseau.

The board accepted the written report and drawings for further study and moved to refer the project to U.S. Sen. Maurice Neuberger and U.S. Rep. Robert Duncan for study in relationship to the proposed National Seashore Recreation Area, which they are sponsoring. The

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gon and thought that Ice Lake and Paulina Lake, pictured in the brochures of the Harney County Land Development Co. were in the vicinity of his land. Ice Lake is 260 miles away in the Wallowa Mountains and Paulina Lake is 150 miles away. John Baricuatro, a Pearl City service station operator, said he answered an ad in the Honolulu Advertiser and bought five lots for \$25 down. He said he received a brochure with a picture of a man boating on a lake

and took it for granted there were fish in the lake." He said he also received the impression there was timber on the land, although earlier in the day defense attorney William H. Morrison read from an information letter sent to prospective buyers which said the tracts were bare of timber.

Didn't Complete Purchases
Cypriano, Barcuatro and Ernest Lee, also of Honolulu, said they decided not to go through with their purchases after learning an investigation was under way.

Also on the stand Wednesday was Mrs. Loretta Murphy, Chicago, a sister-in-law of David Frank Koolish, one of the defendants. She said Koolish had asked to use her signature and she signed several documents for him.

"I didn't read what they were," she said.

A parade of other witnesses testified they had asked for their money back after seeing their land for the first time.

John Scharf, manager of the Malheur Wildlife Refuge near the Lake Valley development, identified many of the photos in the advertising brochure as being taken in the Steens Mountains, about 50 miles to the south. Some he could not identify.

He described the Lake Valley area as flat, treeless, and covered mostly with greasewood, a low, bushy plant. He said Harney Lake was alkaline, dry at times, and unable to sustain fish life for very long.

He agreed there was wildlife in the area, mostly antelope, deer, sagehens, and chukar partridges.

Timber Workers Hearing Drags

PORTLAND (UPI)—A hearing to determine whether 7,100 Northwest timber workers are eligible for unemployment benefits dragged through its third day Thursday despite efforts of a referee to speed it up.

M. F. McFarland, chief appeals referee for the Oregon Department of Employment, ruled that only one attorney for the timber firms and one for the union could raise objections and conduct arguments regarding a witness.

Six lawyers for the Big Six timber operators, fourth for the International Woodworkers of America and the Lumber and Sawmill Workers Union and two Washington assistant attorneys general have been involved.

H. J. Greeley, director of industrial relations for International Paper Co. at Longview, Wash., testified Thursday that the firm did no production work during last summer's lumber strike.

Under Oregon and Washington state law, workers idled by a labor dispute are not eligible for unemployment benefits. Union lawyers have implied that last summer's shutdown by the Big Six members was caused not by a labor dispute, but by other factors, such as the economic condition of the lumber industry.

NEW TREASURER

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Newell J. Carman, 51, of San Francisco took office Tuesday as secretary-treasurer of the 250,000-member International Union of Operating Engineers AFL-CIO.

Carman replaced Frank P. Converse of Cleveland, who resigned after serving a year in the union's No. 2 post.
