

Wild Elk Hunting Tale Heard By Local Hunters

Two Roseburg elk hunters are still shaking their heads over an unlikely hunting incident in Eastern Oregon.

They didn't see it happen but they swear that all facts point to its accuracy. They arrived on the scene just after the elk had been killed.

Thomas Scott of 1620 NW Mulholland Drive in Roseburg and his hunting partner, Dr. Roy

Clinton, had gone to the Tolgate Ranger station area between Weston and Elgin to do their hunting last week.

As they arrived in the hunting area, they saw a man climbing up a hill with an elk head in his arms. He was visibly shaken up. He told the two he was Clarence Freeman of Sandy. He said he and Norman Erickson of the same area had been hunting together.

That's when the story grew fantastic. Freeman said he had spotted an elk and had fired five shells at it. The elk was on a hill above him, and the bullets hit a front and a hind leg. The elk came toppling down on top of the hunter. He hit it with his rifle, breaking the rifle.

When it staggered up, Freeman said he was on its back. They tumbled another hundred feet down the hill.

Freeman said his only possible weapon was a hatchet in his belt. He managed to pull it out and tried to stun the animal by hitting it with the broad of the hatchet. When this failed, he brought the blade down on its spine, finally killing it. Although bruised, scratched and shaken up, the 56-year-old hunter came away from the fray without injury.
