CHICAGO (UPI) — The Chicago White Sox, for the second time in a decade, loaded their American League pennant hopes on a rookie today.

Giants Picked Over Steelers

NEW YORK (UPI) — The odds makers, ignoring the New York Giants' 31-0 setback by Pittsburgh in their first game this season, are quoting Allie Sherman's men as 7-point favorites from their climactic return game with the Steelers at Yankee Stadium Sunday.

The Giants need a win or a tie against the Steelers to qualify for the National Football League's championship playoff for the third straight year.

The Chicago Bears are picked to defeat the Detroit Lions by at least six points at Chicago Sunday and thus wrap up the Western Division championship.

The Green Bay Packers are 17-point favorites over the Forty-Niners in a Saturday afternoon game at San Francisco. The Packers can win the Western crown for the fourth year if they beat the Forty-Niners and the Lions upset the Bears.

In Sunday's other NFL games, the Colts are 9 over the Los Angeles Rams at Baltimore; the Eagles are 1 over the Minnesota Vikings at Philadelphia; the St. Louis Cardinals are picked by 9 at home over the Dallas Cowboys, and the Cleveland Browns are favored by 8 over the Redskins at Washington.

In Saturday afternoon's American Football League games, the Boston Patriots are favored by 2 points over the Chiefs at Kansas City and the Buffalo Bills are 5 over the Jets at New York.

On Sunday, the Oakland Raiders are picked by 13 at home over the Denver Broncos and the San Diego Chargers are 4 over the Oilers at Houston.

In 1956, the Sox traded shortstop Chico Carrasquel and assigned the job to Luis Aparicio. In 1959, the team won the pennant.

East Shrine Team Picked

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — University of Pittsburgh and Purdue each placed three men on the East's grid squad for the Shrine East-West All-Star game Dec. 28, Managing Director William H. Coffman announced today.

The 24-man club is one of the most balanced teams in the history of the game. It has one of the game's great pass catchers in Jim Kelly of Notre Dame; everybody's All-America tackle, Carl Eller of Minnesota; All-America halfback Sherman Lewis of Michigan State, etc.

From Pitt are tackle Ernest Borghetti, Halfback Paul Marzetta and fullback Rick Leeson; from Purdue come end Dave Ellison, quarterback Ron DiGravio and fullback Gene Donaldson.

Tribe Gets Set For Home Openers

O'Neil Sets Point Pace With 42 In Opening Pair

Roseburg's Indians, still smarting from a pair of losses to the Klamath Falls Pelicans, will try their luck in a two-game series with the Grants Pass Cavemen this weekend.

Friday the Indians will play their first game before the home fans, then will travel to Grants Pass for Saturday's clash. Jayvee action both nights will start at 6:15, with the varsity games beginning at 8.

Season tickets for the Indians' 10 home games may be purchased by contacting the Roseburg High athletic office.

While the Tribe cagers were being topped at Klamath Falls, 57-49 and 72-55, the Cavemen were also suffering a pair of setbacks. Friday the Cavemen could not cope with a strong fourth quarter showing by the Linfield Jayvees, losing 77-59. Saturday the Willamette University Jayvees dumped the Cavemen, 72-61.

In last year's meeting between the two teams, the Indians captured their lone non-league victory, beating the Cavemen 61-40 before the home fans. In the first game the Cavemen had stopped the local crew.

The Indians boast a towering crew this year, with three players 6-5 or better, including starting center John Johnson (6-5) and forward Bruce O'Neil (6-6). While the Cavemen are not noted for their height, they feature speed and ball control. The Cavemen have a strong nucleus of veterans back to lead the charge, including Tom Sparlin who paced the scoring attack in the opening weekend games.

O'Neil provided Roseburg with most of its scoring at Klamath Falls. The lanky senior forward potted 17 field goals and hit eight for 11 shots from the foul line for a two-game total of 42 points.

Guard Butch Watson follows O'Neil in the early season scoring totals with 21 points in the two games, while Gary Hill, 6-3 forward, has hit for 16 points.

Hill and O'Neil are the leading rebounders after two games.

As a team the Indians are hitting at a .345 clip from the field, connecting on 38 of 110 shots in the two-game series at Klamath Falls. From the foul line Roseburg has converted 28 of 49 attempts, and the Tribe has grabbed off 67 rebounds.

The opponents, Klamath Falls, scored its 129 points on 48 field goals and 33 for 54 at the foul line.

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Canyonville Tigers Open Cage Season On Weekend

The Tigers of Canyonville will raise the curtain on the 1963-64 basketball season competing in the Canyonville Bible Academy Invitational Tournament this weekend.

Last week the Tigers competed in the South Bico-B League Jamboree, but to date have not played a regulation game. Along with the Tigers in the CBA tournament will be the host Pilots, the Camas Valley Hornets and the Salem Academy quintet.

Coach Bob Rowe states that the Bico-B circuit will be tough and well-balanced this year, and feels that the Tigers will be in contention for the crown providing their shooting accuracy remains good.

The Tigers boast three returning lettermen which are expected to make the Canyonville team strong in the front line. Returning center Mike Heath (6-5) will give Canyonville strength under the boards as well as on defense. Along with Heath, the Tigers have returnees in forwards George Muetzel (6-2) and Roney Long (5-10).

At the guard spots the Tigers have four players vying for starting positions. This quartet includes Roger Hammond (5-6), John Aaronson (5-8), Jerry Zumwalt (5-6) and Burt McNeal (5-6).

Other top prospects for the forward spots include Bob Neis (5-10) and Bruce Johnson (5-9).

In Bico-B League competition Rowe feels that the top competition for the Tigers is expected to come from Elktion, Powers and Oakland — though Oakland's B status seems to be in doubt because of a recent Oregon Schools Activities Association ruling which lists the Oakers as an A-2 competitor.

Following the weekend tournament at CBA, the Tigers will play the Grants Pass Jayvees Dec. 21 at Grants Pass before taking a break for the holidays. The first league counter finds the Tigers meeting Oakland Jan. 10. Home games will start at 8 p.m., with the Jayvee games set for 6:30.

Bill McKinney will serve as assistant coach of the Tigers.

Oakland Matmen Feature 8 Returning Lettermen

Oakland's matmen, sporting a 1-1 record to date in dual meets, will boast eight lettermen returning to form the nucleus of the varsity squad which is set for competition in District 6-A-2-B competition this year.

The Oakers opened the season with a win over Myrtle Creek, then fell in a thriller to the Sutherlin Bulldogs.

Returning to head the charge for coach Stuart Ferris' crew will be two-year veterans, Mike Williamson, Bob Beck, Eddie Wood, and Lyle Telgenhoff. Williamson is a junior competing in the 136-pound bracket, while Beck wrestles at 141 pounds and is also a junior.

Wood is a junior in the 148-pound division and Telgenhoff is the lone senior among the 13 varsity starters and competes in the 157 pound category.

One-year vets include Greg McDonald at 106 pounds, Larry Vara and Danny Cramer at 123 pounds, Dale Tenness at 130 pounds and Ted Germond at 131 pounds. All are sophomores.

Among the newcomers coach Ferris lists the most promising prospects as Marty Hakanson at 98 pounds, Orville Green at 115 pounds, Martin Crouch at 168 pounds, Mike McDonald at 178 pounds and Murlie Carson in the heavyweight bracket. Green and Carson are freshmen, Mike McDonald and Crouch are juniors and the rest are sophomores.

The next match for the Oakers will be Thursday against the Glide Wildcats. The Oakland-Glide meet will be staged at Oakland at 7 p.m.
