Douglas County's A-2 hoop squads have a full schedule of encounters lined up this week — with only the Drain Warriors set for league encounters.

The Warriors will open, Emerald League play by entertaining the Elmira Falcons Friday, then will host the McKenzie Eagles Saturday. Jayvee action will begin at 6:30 both nights, with varsity play to start at 8.

The six Umpqua Valley League teams have non-league battles set for the weekend. Friday Sutherlin's Bulldogs will host the Yoncalla Eagles, Oakland's Oakers will invade Riddle for a battle with the Irish. Glendale's Pirates will travel to Rogue River to face the Chieftains, the Glide Wildcats will travel to Rogue River to face the Chieftains, the Glide Wildcats will entertain the Phoenix Pirates, Douglas' Trojans will be at Myrtle Point against the Bobcats and the Gold Beach Panthers will clash with the Myrtle Creek Vikings at Myrtle Creek.

Saturday's schedule finds Illinois Valley at Glendale, Glide at Eagle Point, Gold Beach at Myrtle Creek, Mapleton at Douglas, Sutherlin at Phoenix and Riddle at Yoncalla. Varsity action each night will get underway way at 8, with the Jayvee games being played at 6:30.

Myrtle Creek and Douglas enter the weekend's encounters boasting the only unbeaten marks among the local A-2 teams. Both the Vicks and the Trojans sport perfect 2-0 records. Myrtle Creek rolled to victories over Mapleton and Myrtle Point in the opening weekend, while the Trojans tamed Bandon and Eagle Point.

The Wildcats of Glide sport a 1-1 record, winning a one-point decision over Myrtle Point in the opener, then losing to Phoenix by the same margin the following night. Riddle bounced back after an opening loss to St. Mary's of Medford to topple Yoncalla, while Glendale opened the season with a win over Rogue River before falling to Oakland. Sutherlin is looking for its first win, with the Bulldogs losing to Phoenix and Central Linn in last week's initial games.

Drain will open in Emerald League play after losing a 44-40 non-league decision to the Elkton Elks in an opener played last week. The Warriors sport fair height and speed with Graham and Ramsey Derbyshire leading the scoring attack in the first game, bucketing 13 and 10 points respectively.

Among the Umpqua Valley League teams, the Irish of Riddle boast the two leading point-makers after one weekend of action. Guard Mike Markham potted 55 points in his first two games to rank as the top scorer, while Gary Paetz, working from the other guard spot for the Irish, is following with an average of 19.5 point per game.

Myrtle Creek boasts Larry Pringle, Jerry Willson and Bob Fuller among the top UVL scorers, while Douglas is represented by Larry Samples, Dan Withers and Bob Shepherd. Jack Rust, the No. 3 scorer in the UVL, and John DeGroot lead the Glide quintet; Jim Redfield, Nick Derscheid and Rodolfo Gutierrez are the top point-makers for Glendale; and Sutherlin's attack is paced by Mike Ouellette, and Don Goertzen.
