Displaying a solid mat attack, the Myrtle Creek Vikings rolled to a decisive 47-13 wrestling win over the Riddle Irish Thursday at Riddle.

The Viks got off to a fast start with pins in the opening three matches to build up a 15-0 lead before the Irish broke into the scoring column on Doyle Jones' 123-pound decision. Myrtle Creek totaled its points on seven pins, two forfeits and a draw. The Irish scored on two decisions, one pin and the draw.

Bryant Suit Due Feb. 10

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (UPI)—A federal district judge Thursday set Feb. 10 as the beginning of trial in Alabama Coach Paul (Bear) Bryant's \$10.5 million libel suits against Curtis Publishing Co.

Court officials said Bryant's two suits concerning separate Saturday Evening Post articles would be heard during the trial. Bryant sought \$10 million on the basis of a story last spring, "Story of a College Football Fix," which said he and former Georgia Athletic Director Wally Butts tried to rig the 1962 Alabama-Georgia game.

The other suit was for \$500,000 for an article published last year which Bryant claims implied he approves of football brutality.

Butts also filed suit against the magazine after the story last spring and was awarded a \$3.06 million judgment by a federal jury at Atlanta. Curtis has sought a new trial.

The Post article said insurance salesman George Burnett of Atlanta was accidentally connected to a long distance telephone call from Butts to Bryant.

Grants Pass Invades Indian Teepee; Victory No. 1 Eyed

Opening before the home fans tonight, the Roseburg Indian cagers draw the rugged assignment of containing the scrappy Grants Pass Cavemen.

Tonight's battle will be the first of a home-and-home series against the Cavemen, with the two teams moving to the Grants Pass boards Saturday. Game time both nights is 6:15 for the Jayvee battles and 8 for the varsity clashes.

Both teams will enter tonight's game looking for victory No. 1. The Tribe cagers lost to the strong Klamath Falls Pelicans in both ends of a two-game series last weekend, 57-49 and 72-55. The Cavemen also sport an 0-2 record, but Roseburg will be the first prep opponent for the Southern Oregon power—with both opening losses being to college Jayvee teams.

The Cavemen fell to a strong fourth quarter showing by the Linfield Jayvees in the season's opener, 77-59, then lost a 72-61 decision to the Willamette University Jayvees the following night.

Roseburg boasts a wealth of tall timber this year, but to date this height has failed to give the Indians an advantage, as coach Curt Jarvis looks for the combination that will click.

Jarvis reports that the only definite starter for tonight's game is Bruce O'Neil, a 6-6 senior. However, O'Neil may start at either a forward or the center position. The lanky O'Neil is the team's top scorer to date with a total of 42 points in the two games—an average of 21 points per game. In addition the veteran eager ranks as the top rebounder for the Indians.

Gary Hill, standing 6-3, is a probable starter at one forward position. Hill is a top rebounder and ranks third in scoring for the Tribe with 16 points in the Klamath Falls series.

John Johnson, 6-5, may be in the lineup at the post position—the spot he played against the Pelicans. However, if Jarvis moves O'Neil to center, then Dave Sevall, 6-1, will probably open as a forward after seeing action as a guard in the openers.

The two starting guards will come from Butch Watson (5-10), Gary Heeter (6-1), Sevall or Bob McKee (6-0), with Mike Sloan (5-10) set to see plenty of action as a guard. Watson ranks as the runnerup to O'Neil in scoring.

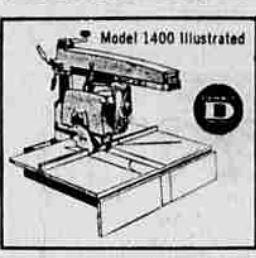

Sellout Expected For NFL Game Between Giants, Pitt

 Midnight strikes somewhere around 4:45 p.m. in New York Sunday for the Cinderella team of the National Football League.

That's approximately the hour when the Pittsburgh Steelers either will have qualified for their first championship playoff or their gallant effort to beat out the New York Giants will end in disappointing defeat.

The Giants are 7-point favorites for this winner-take-all game that will draw a sellout crowd of nearly 70,000 to Yankee Stadium. Because of the peculiar nature of this year's standings, the Giants also can clinch the Eastern Division crown by holding the Steelers to a tie.

The Chicago Bears could

clinch the Western Division title Saturday afternoon without even facing a pair of cleats, although it's not likely.

The Green Bay Packers, clinging to a slim hope of overtaking the Bears, meet the San Francisco Forty Niners Saturday in a nationally televised game (CBS) from the West Coast starting at 4:35 p.m. (EST).

If the Packers should be upset, the Bears would automatically qualify for the championship playoff game. If the Packers should win, the Bears then would be required to clinch the title on their own, against the troublesome Detroit Lions on Sunday.

Green Bay is a 17-point pick over San Francisco and Chicago is favored by 6 over Detroit.

The St. Louis Cardinals and the Cleveland Browns both have 9-4 records and have a shot at second-place money and a berth in the playoff (Runner-

up) Bowl game at Miami Jan. 5. The Cards are favored by 9 at home against the Dallas Cowboys and the Browns are picked by 8 over the Redskins at Washington.

In Sunday's other games, the Baltimore Colts are the choice by 9 at home over the Los Angeles Rams and the Philadelphia Eagles are 1-point picks at home over the Minnesota Vikings.

Roseburg's matmen will travel to Medford Saturday in search of their first victory of the season, tangling with the perennially powerful Black Tornado crew.

The Tribe Jayvees will wrestle the preliminary matches at 1:30 p.m., with the Indian varsity grapplers to take over the mats at approximately 3.

In their opening dual meet, the Indians lost a close decision to the Crater Comets, 27-22. The local crew scored its first win in several years over the Black Tornado matmen last year, winning the dual meet before the home fans, 27-18.
