Sutherlin Bulldogs Down Yoncalla's Eagles 57-31

Sutherlin's Bulldogs pulled away from the invading Yoncalla Eagles in the second half to record a 57-31 non-league hoop win Friday.

The winners got off to a fast start, building a 16-5 first quarter advantage. However, the Eagles got hot in the second quarter and diminished the lead by five points.

A 21-point second quarter by the Elmira Falcons resulted in the Drain Warriors dropping a 55-51 Emerald League opener Friday before the home fans.

California's pressing defense kept the Beavers under pressure throughout the game, forcing the harassed visitors to commit 20 ball control errors while California committed only eight.

It was the nationally-ranked Beavers' first loss against four wins while California is now 2-1.

Superb defensive play by Howard Holt of the Bears constantly jammed up Oregon State's attack. Wall led California's scoring with 17 points. Jim Jarvis was high for Oregon State with 18.
