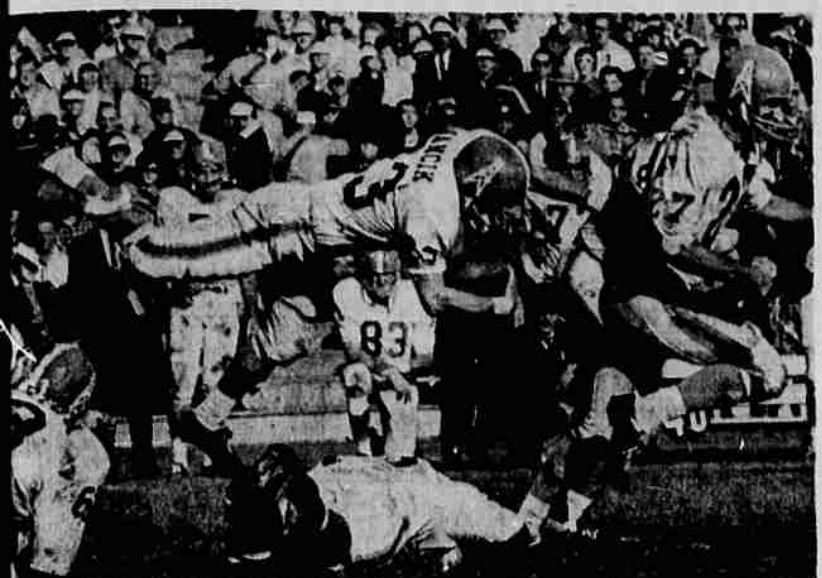

Canyonville Quintet Falls To Caveman JV's 52-42

Canyonville's Tigers came on strong after a slow start, but still ended on the short end of a 52-42 final count Saturday against the host Grants Pass Jayvee quintet in non-league action.

The Tigers had trouble getting their eye in the first period, falling behind 16-5 during the first eight minutes of play. In the second period the Tigers started to come on strong, cutting the lead to eight points by the halftime intermission.

After trailing through the third quarter, the Tigers exploded for a quick rally in the opening minutes of the final stanza to knot the score at 40-40. However, at this point a couple of fouls sent the Cavemen Jayvees to the charity stripe where the winners broke the deadlock and moved away from the fiery invaders.

Canyonville's Mike Heath captured the scoring honors for the game, bucketing 19 points. George Muetzel followed the lowering Tiger center with nine points.

Tim Reddick, Dick Rice and Burt Jamison each had 12 points for the winning Grants Pass Jayvees.

Canyonville had trouble finding the range from the field, hitting only 25 per cent of its field goal attempts. The Cavemen Jayvees had a 39 per cent shooting average from the field. In the preliminary game the Grants Pass sophomore team rolled to a 69-35 triumph over the Canyonville Jayvees. Roy McNeil pumped in 13 points to earn the scoring honors for the losers.
