

Bulgarian Diplomat Enters Guilty Plea On Espionage Count

VIENNA (UPI) — A Bulgarian diplomat pleaded guilty today to charges that he was an American spy who collected \$200,000 from the United States to pay for his affairs with "loose women."

The Bulgarian Telegraph Agency reported that Ivan Assen Hristov Georgiev, 56, entered the guilty plea before the Bulgarian Supreme Court.

"I have committed the heaviest of crimes that can be committed by man, a crime which has always received the heaviest punishment at all times," the agency said Georgiev told the court.

Shortly after testifying Georgiev became ill, and the afternoon court session was adjourned.

Western experts said Bulgarian law prescribes a maximum

penalty of death by shooting for treason.

The former counselor at the Bulgarian mission to the United Nations in New York was charged with spying for the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) for seven years and collecting about \$200,000 for his work, which the Bulgarians said he spent on "loose women" and various mistresses.

"I placed myself voluntarily in the service of U.S. intelligence," Georgiev was reported to have told the court.

Describes Activities

The Bulgarian agency said Georgiev gave the court a detailed description of his activities which included giving the CIA political, economic and military secrets.

Georgiev, identified as the president of the International Institute of Space Law, worked secretly for the U.S. from his New York post for five years and in Europe until his arrest about three months ago, the agency said.

It said Georgiev used the code name of "Georges Duval" for his "espionage activities."

After testifying this morning, Georgiev became ill and the court granted a defense request for adjournment of the afternoon session, the agency said. It said only that Georgiev had suffered an "indisposition."

Agency Mentions Letter

The agency said Georgiev at one point wrote a letter directly to former CIA Chief Allen Dulles complaining about the attitude CIA agents were taking toward him and the refusal of his request for \$60,000 to found an international institute of philosophy.

Georgiev was quoted as saying U.S. intelligence wanted to bring him down to "the position of an ordinary police informant." The agency said CIA agents "asked him not only for political information but also for ordinary police information relative to Bulgarians who had fled abroad."

The agency called him "politically and morally rotten to the marrow of his bones" and said he was "a most malicious enemy and traitor to the Bulgarian people."

"For many years Assen Georgiev has been indulging in an immoral sort of life," it said. "He had criminal and immoral connections with many loose women and supported several mistresses both in Bulgaria and abroad."

According to the agency, he fed the United States "important" Bulgarian political, economic and military secrets. It said he met secretly with CIA agents and sent clandestine messages out of Bulgaria to a radio center in Greece operated by U.S. intelligence.

I. N. Gray, Lions Club president, said many entries qualified for the fourth and fifth prizes and that the judges had a difficult time making their final decisions.

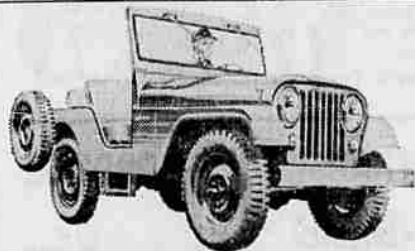
This year's contest was open to all residents in the Canyonville School District.

Hungary Train Crash Toll Of Death Mounts

BUDAPEST, Hungary (UPI) — The death toll in the Christmas Eve train crash near Szolnok has risen to 43, the Hungarian news agency MTI reported Wednesday.

Of the 36 other persons injured in the wreck, two were in critical condition and 17 in serious condition, the agency said.

The train's engineer was arrested following an official inquiry and charged with failing to observe safety measures in a thick fog, MTI said.

Lakonia's Passengers Continue Rap Against Crew's Action In Disaster

LONDON (UPI) — The Greek liner Arkadia headed for the British Isles today carrying 120 passengers and 150 crewmen who survived the fearful fire aboard its sister ship, the Lakonia. About 100 other survivors refused to sail on another ship of the line.

The Arkadia's departure from the Madeira Island port of Funchal was delayed because of the dispute. Some of the dissident passengers will return to England aboard the Transvaal Castle on Monday. Others will come back by plane.

The controversy over the performance of the Lakonia's captain and crew continued to rage in London, where returning survivors made strong allegations that were denied vigorously. A spokesman for the Greek line, operators of the Lakonia, said that 985 persons out of 1,027 were accounted for, including 89 whose bodies were recovered.

42 Still Missing

But 42 persons were still missing as a result of the fire that virtually consumed the Lakonia last Sunday night as it neared Madeira. The ship was on a Christmas holiday cruise.

Wednesday Capt. Mateos Zarbis, skipper of the Lakonia, denied charges that his crew panicked as the flames broke out of control and everyone was forced to abandon the vessel.

"There was no panic aboard my ship — neither with the crew nor the passengers," he said in a telephone interview.

"The crew did quite well," Zarbis said. "They worked well." The skipper promised to make a full statement in London "in a couple of days."

His voice cracking with emotion, Zarbis emphasized repeatedly that reports of panic among the crew were "not true."
