Nick Kozak will pit his airplane spin against the cannonball smash of Tony Borne in the featured pro wrestling match on Saturday's card at the Community Building of the Douglas County Fairgrounds.

The winner of the main event has been promised a crack at the Northwest heavyweight championship which will belong to the winner of tonight's bout between Maurice (Mad Dog) Vachon and The Destroyer in Portland. Vachon is the current Northwest champion.

Saturday's bouts at the Fairgrounds will start at 8:30 a.m. Tickets will be on sale at the gate.

Battling in the opening match will be a pair of newcomers to the Roseburg area—Irish Paddy Barrett and Frenchman Louie Tillet. The semifinal will find Shag Thomas, head-butting Negro, and Dirty Don Duffy.

The main event between Kozak and Borne promises to be a rugged, no-holds barred bout as both men are anxious to get a chance at the championship belt. Kozak, a local favorite, is noted for his airplane spin and reports he has been studying new ways of trapping Borne with his favorite hold. Kozak's ambition is to go on to a world's championship, and he is continually working towards this goal. He relies primarily on scientific holds, but can match blows with the roughest ring opponents when the situation arises.

Borne is just the opposite, using any tactics available to him in winning bouts. The rugged Oregonian from Pendleton specializes in his cannonball smash off the ropes which has been known to completely destroy opponents, and the bearded "meanie" is not noted for sticking very close to the rules while in the ring.

Markham, Manley Lead Loop Scoring

Going into tonight's round of non-league hoop encounters Mike Markham of Riddle and Kerney Manley of Oakland hold the scoring leads in the Umpqua Valley and Bico-B Leagues, respectively.

Markham, the flashy Irish guard, has bucketed 54 field goals and has made 32 of 50 free throw attempts in six games for a total of 140 points—an average of 23.33 points per game.

The closest challenger to Markham is Glendale's Jim Redfield who has potted 110 points in six games for an average of 18.33 points-per-game. Larry Pringle of Myrtle Creek is third in the UVL scoring race with 138 points in nine games for a 15.33 average, followed by Glide's Jack Rust with 91 points on six games for a 15.17 average.

Manley has scored 58 points in three games for a 19.33 average per game to lead the Bico-B pointmakers, while teammate Jon Lamoreaux is running second with an average of 15 points-per-game.

Don Suloff of Elkton's undefeated Elks is third among the Bico-B scorers with 74 points in five games for a 14.8 average, while Powers' Dan Taylor is fourth with a 14.25 points-per-game average.

A full weekend of non-league action is on tap for the UVL and Bico-B teams, with league play to open Jan. 10 in both circuits.

Friday's UVL games will find Phoenix at Myrtle Creek, Douglas at Mapleton, Glide at Myrtle Point, Glendale at Canyonville, St. Mary's of Medford at Riddle and Sutherlin at Central Linn. Saturday Myrtle Creek will be at Myrtle Point, Douglas entertains St. Mary's, Glide travels to Mapleton, Glendale hosts Canyonville, Riddle is at Oakland and Sutherlin invades Yoncalla.

Friday's encounters involving Bico-B teams will find Prospect at Days Creek, Elkton hosting Drain, Oakland at Camas Valley, Glendale at Canyonville and Powers at Gold Beach. Saturday Elkton will be at Coos Bay against the Marshfield Jayvees, Yoncalla hosts Sutherlin.

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Roseburg To Host Invitational Battles

Roseburg's Indians will return to mat warfare after an absence of 16 days Saturday when they host the second annual Roseburg Invitational Tournament.

Competing against the Tribematsmen will be the Klamath Falls Pelicans, the Medford Black Tornado and the Marshfield Pirates. The Pelicans of Klamath Falls come into the tournament as the defending champions, and once again are rated as a powerful team that will be in the thick of the battle for the crown.

The Pelicans scored 102 points last year, with the host Redskins taking runner-up honors with 80 points.

Medford Newcomer
Medford is the lone newcomer to the Roseburg Invitational. The Black Tornado, one of the perennial powers in the state in all sports, replaces the Crater Comets who will not be in action this year. In last year's tournament Marshfield finished fourth—just one point behind Crater.

Saturday's action will begin at 10:30 a.m., and will last until approximately 5 p.m.

The host Indians will be hoping to break into the victory column in a big way as they seek the crown. The local crew lost three consecutive dual meets

before taking a break for the holidays. Crater tripped the Indians, 27-22 and 36-16. Sandwiched between the two setbacks at the hands of the Comets was a 43-13 loss to powerful Medford. Klamath Falls and Medford come into the Roseburg Invitational ranked as the two teams to beat, while the host Indians and the Pirates of Marshfield are figured as darkhorse contenders. Both the Indians and the Pirates feature strong competitors in certain weight divisions, but lack the over-all team strength of the Southern Oregon powers.

Records Matched
In the three matches to date the Indians have scored 51 points on nine decisions, two pins, two draws and two forfeits. On the other hand, the three opponents have racked up 106 points—including 70 points on 14 pins.

Varsity performers for the Indians to date have included Mike Raiche at 98 pounds, Don Langenberg at 106 pounds, Jay Zurcher at 115 pounds, Matt Frey at 123 pounds and John Waldron at 130 pounds.

Raiche and Langenberg each have two victories and one defeat, with the 98-pounder boasting one of the pins and a forfeit while Langenberg has a decision and a forfeit to his credit. Frey, Waldron and Zurcher are still seeking their first wins.

Jumping up to 136 pounds, the Indians have two top performers in Wayne Gray and Lonnie Good. Gray has a decision and a draw in two matches, while Good won his 126-pound bout the first week of the season.

Grapplers Listed
Wrestling at 141 pounds will be either Pat Doyle or Rich Holder. Doyle was "wrestler of the week" for his win in the final matches before the holiday break, while Holder has one decision and a loss on a default. Ron Begley has been handling the chores at 148 pounds and has a 2-1 record.

Tom Thomas, rugged 157-pounder, is undefeated in three matches. However, in his most recent outing Thomas was held to a draw. Stan Rich and Mike Bigler are capable of competing at either 168 or 178 pounds, with both still looking for victory No. 1.

In the heavier brackets Dick Spielman has been wrestling at 191 pounds for the last two outings. Spielman has a 0-2 record. Terry Byrd, another 191-pounder, has the second Roseburg pin which he collected in the opening encounter of the season. In the heavyweight bracket Tom Albertson has suffered three successive defeats, though he has been close to winning at least two of the matches before tiring in the closing seconds.

Illini Fight Song Now Radio Fare

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. (UPI) — A Seattle disc jockey Thursday paid off a Rose Bowl bet by singing the Illinois fight song over Station WDWS here.

The bet was between Ray Court, disc jockey at Station KING in Seattle, and news director Bill Rusnak of WDWS.

If Illinois won, Court was to sing the Illini song over his station for five consecutive days, and on one day would sing it by telephone, over WDWS. If Washington had won, Rusnak was to sing the Washington song over his station and KING.
